THIS WEEK'S REFLECTIONS

Almighty ever-living God, grant that we may always conform our will to yours and serve your majesty in sincerity of heart. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.

Today's Mass Readings

1st reading: Isaiah 53:10-11
2nd reading: Hebrews 4:14-16
Gospel: Mark 10:35-45

It is in the Gospel of Mark that we see most clearly how Jesus overturns the values of our society. Power, prestige and wealth are no longer important. What is most important is our willingness to express our love in service of others.

These truths are called Gospel irony, for they make no sense in the logic of this world; there is a greater wisdom, however, that St. Paul calls the wisdom of the cross.

Responsorial Psalm Meditation

Ps 33:4-5, 18-20, 22

The Responsorial Psalm comes from a hymn of praise. It glorifies the Lord whose word is upright and just.

Because God is so good, we can turn to Him and entrust our plea into His hands. He will surely reply to our entreaty with great generosity, for we have placed our trust in Him.

This psalm was normally sung as a response to an intervention in which God rescued those who had called upon Him, but it can also be used as a hymn of trust by those who have not yet seen that intervention.

That is when it is especially difficult to trust in God, for we cannot yet see the evidence of his concern. Still, it is then that we show that we truly trust in God (when trust seems all but impossible).
