## Today's Mass Readings

1st Reading: Jeremiah 1:4-5, 17-19

2nd Reading: 1 Corinthians 12:31-13:13

Gospel: Luke 4:21-30

1st Reading Reflection: *We often tell ourselves that we can't do something (e.g., forgive someone, share our faith publicly, perform a particular ministry, etc.). While it is probably true that we cannot do these things on our own, our recognition of our inability can actually be a moment of conversion in which we reach out to God who can give us the strength to do what we think is impossible.*

## Responsorial Psalm Meditation

Ps 71:1-6, 15, 17

The Responsorial Psalm continues the themes found in the First Reading. We are called to proclaim the justice of God.

We have been taught God's ways from our youth. We have to proclaim those ways both in word and deed.

This is not simply a job to do as if we can live our faith when it is convenient. This is who we are, for this is why God created us.

Yet, we cannot do this on our own. We have neither the necessary talents nor the courage. We must depend on God's strength because he will accomplish great things in and through us.

God is our rock and our fortress. He is our refuge in times of difficulty. He is the only one who can rescue us from the hands of the wicked.
