## THIS WEEK'S REFLECTIONS

*Keep your family safe, O Lord, with unfailing care, that, relying solely on the hope of heavenly grace, they may be defended always by your protection. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.*

## Today's Mass Readings

1st Reading: Isaiah 6:1-8

2nd Reading: 1 Corinthians 15:1-11

Gospel: Luke 5:1-11

*In the Old Testament, one tended to encounter the holiness of God by going up a mountain or entering the Holy of Holies in the temple. When Jesus died on the cross, though, the veil of the temple split open from top to bottom. This was symbolic, from it tells us that the holiness of God is no longer shut up in a particular room in the temple. It has come crashing out into the world.*

*We can see this in the Sacraments. Jesus and the Church have chosen everyday things to be instruments of God's love: bread, wine, water, oil, words, breath, and touch.*

*We can also encounter the holiness of God in so many everyday things around us: sunrise, leaves and flowers, food, etc. God communicates his goodness and holiness in many, many ways.*

## Responsorial Psalm Meditation

Ps 138:1-5, 7-8

The Responsorial Psalm continues the theme found in the First Reading. It is a celebration of the tremendous holiness of God.

We cannot even begin to comprehend the greatness and glory of our God. Our human mind and human experience are limited, but God is not.

Our only possible response to this encounter with the holiness of God is to praise the glory of God. We join in the hymn sung by the angels that proclaims the holiness of God.

Whenever we enter the temple of God (or our parish church or any place where God's holiness is evident), we are filled with a sense of joy, gratitude and wonder.
