## Responsorial Psalm Meditation

Ps 103:1-4, 8, 10, 12-13

In the First Reading and the Gospel we are invited to adopt a new way of looking at the world: one based upon mercy.

The Responsorial Psalm reminds us that we have learned what mercy means from the way that the Lord has treated us.

God has redeemed us and crowned us with kindness and compassion. He is slow to anger. He has forgiven our sins.

The definition of justice is to give to each person what each truly deserves. We would think that we want God to be just at the Last Judgment. That is not true. We do not want God to be just, we want God to be merciful.

If God were truly just, then we would all go to hell. (this is true even if we only committed one little venial sin our entire life.) We truly seek the mercy and compassion of God.

## LEARNING ABOUT THE PRIESTHOOD

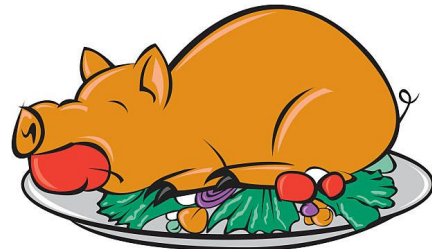
