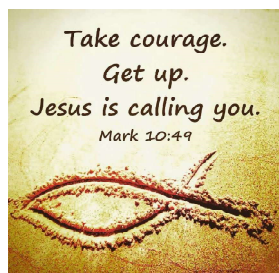

Jericho was a trading post for merchants crowded with people seeking to buy necessities and luxuries. As Jesus passed through a crowd gathered around him; despite the crowd, or possibly because of it, Bartimaeus, a blind man, believed that Jesus could help him. Jesus tells Bartimaeus. *Your faith has saved you.* That was great news for Bartimaeus. He regained his sight and then “followed Jesus on the way.” Jesus was teaching the crowd and us that faith can restore our sight, our vision of God. Through faith we can see God’s great love for us and all that he has given to us for ourselves and for others. No other institution has discerned, defined and articulated the mind of God for His creation as faithfully and consistently as the Roman Catholic Church. To be good stewards of our faith we must constantly grow in our understanding and appreciation of the beauty and truth in God’s creation in Revelation and in the tradition and teachings of the Catholic Church. Like Bartimaeus we must pray, “Master, I want to see.” If we are good stewards of our faith, our faith will save us.

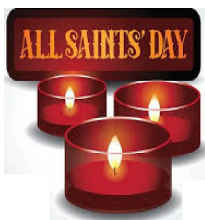
