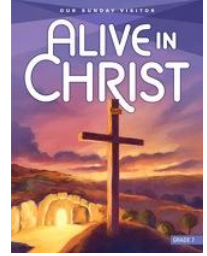


Faith Formation Models for 2019-2020

Traditional Classroom Program

In a classroom setting, 21 faith lessons are presented from September through April, with approximately three classes each month. Sessions:

Sunday Session 1:	8:40 am – 9:50 am	(St. Benedict)
Sunday Session 2:	11:10 am – 12:20 pm	(St. Benedict)
Tuesday Session 3:	6:00 pm – 7:15 pm	(St. Benedict)
Saturday Session 4:	9:00 am – 10:30 am	(St. Francis)

Family Catechesis Program – “Families Alive in Christ”

This model is a total family approach to catechesis, designed for families to grow in their faith together. The curriculum is 21 faith lessons from October through April.

The program requires families to attend one faith learning session each month.

On Site Faith Sessions will include:

Gathering for a meal, prayer & large group presentations; breakout session with age –appropriate lessons, themed activities, and sharing.

Sunday On-Site Sessions	9:00 am – 10:45 am	(St. Francis)
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Middle School (Grades 7 & 8)

The Middle School program from all three churches will be united into one program on Sundays, by grade. (7th & 8th will alternate weeks.) in a nontraditional setting.

Sundays	8:30 am – 10:00 am	(St. Benedict)
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Homeschool Program

The Homeschool model offers home based learning with the Parent as primary teacher. The curriculum has 21 faith lessons to be completed at home at the parent’s discretion. (One lesson per week is preferable.)

Children are expected to attend at least on parish event in the year (Adoration, Visit to Bethlehem, Mardi Gras, Vacation Bible School . . .)

Homeschool is not an option for First Reconciliation and First Communion.
