

Lent begins March 1. This Lent, let St. Matthew lead us as we grow in our relationship with Jesus! We'll do this through three opportunities:

- 1. By reading the entire Gospel of Matthew in manageable daily readings. We will use our own Bibles, but we'll give the verses to read each day. Reading this Gospel, start to finish, will allow us to experience Lent in a way we may never have in the past. By Easter we'll know Jesus better, more deeply.
- 2. By using an accompanying daily devotional Lent with St. Matthew. Melissa Ohden, the survivor of a failed saline infusion abortion in 1977 will share her story at St. James Catholic Church in Liberty at 7pm on February 7. In 2012, she founded The Abortion Survivors Network (ASN). ASN seeks to educate the public about failed abortions and survivors while providing emotional, mental and spiritual support to survivors. She is the author of "You Carried Me, a daughter's memoir", her story about what happens when an abortion survivor finds and forgives her birth mother, who never knew her daughter was alive.
