Fr. Lance's Letter

Last Thursday, May 31, our St. Virgil's Young Adult Group came together from their first meeting. There were 11 young adults attending this meeting, and a few others were unable because of work commitments. Our group looked at three goals: Fellowship, Understanding and Community Service. Getting to know each other and sharing their faith, hopes and vision were important. On a lighter note there was much interest in intramural sports and bon fires. What is important for all of us to know is that our young adults want to gather as a faith community, celebrate Eucharist and be active in our church, participate in serving others and in outreach programs, and let our parish of St. Virgil be a place for active communication, worship and outreach. A Facebook page has been created for our Young Adults and some 40 people are currently in communication with each other. May our prayers be added to that of our Young Adults for their growth and progress,

for their well-being and joy in the Lord. Our special thanks to **Andrew DeBlock** who heads this group and is most instrumental in its initial success.

On Saturday, June 2, our Parish Pastoral Council met from 8:30 AM until 11:30 AM. We looked at our Church Ministry Core Values and realized that Community (caring about and addressing the needs of others) and Family were very important to our parishioners. Preaching and Teaching Scripture (communicating God’s Word to our people), Worship and Prayer (communicating with God) are core values that bring us together. As a parish we are low on Evangelization (telling others the good news about Christ), and the Unchurched (people who may not attend church and those who have stopped coming). There is a good possibility that we are satisfied with our “status quo” (a preference for the way things are now). It was the felt need of our Parish Pastoral Council that we need to move from a church of “subtraction” into a church of “addition” and grow over into a church of “multiplication”. Our PPC took time to look deeper into our parish identity and dominant values. While our parish has a preference for “structure” in terms of well-functioning organizations and ministries, our focus is often inward and task oriented. We recognize

better attempts being made toward fellowship, unity and community building, yet we are encircled by what happens within our parish. We need to be a parish that welcomes those “outside” of the church, become effective in bringing the unchurched into the parish family.

Our PPC has decided to meet again in early July and review the Mission of our parish. We need to have a vision and share this with our fellow parishioners. In the mean time we recognize the need to have better communication and even hire someone to make our story (and stories) of St. Virgil Parish more available, accessible, visually appealing, attractive and user-friendly. We want all our parishioners and all who join us in worship and fellowship to feel blessed by God, happy to belong and proud to serve. We ask for your prayers, your support and your trust in our desire to make St. Virgil Parish our home with God and each other.

Let us continue to thank our God for the numerous blessings we receive through the prayers and ministry of St. Virgil Parish. We are grateful to our PPC and ask the Lord to share with us His abundant blessings and graces.

Weekly Reflections

EVANGELIZATION CORNER



If one word could be used to describe our society today, it might be pluralism. Pluralism denotes the existence of a diversity of views rather than a single viewpoint. Diversity has always existed in our society. It is founded on differing belief systems and it is necessary if we are to foster respect between the different elements of our society.

Many of us were raised in an era when a Christian awareness of faith ran through and shaped our culture. The diversity that existed was predominately an intra-Christian phenomenon (i.e., Catholic, Lutheran, Methodist, Presbyterian, etc.). The pluralism we face today is no longer only an intra-Christian phenomenon. Frequently we encounter people who wish to belong to the Church, but who are strongly shaped by a vision of life which is in contrast with the faith.

Today, we are witnessing a religious fragmentation that no longer acknowledges a unifying belief. Nowhere is this more prevalent than in the various religions that coexist within the same neighborhoods of our large cities and in many of our 'bedroom communities'; Morris County being no exception. Even within individual religions we can find diversity in the way people understand their religious obligations.

Pluralism poses new challenges for us as we try to respond to the call to evangelize. In proclaiming the Good News, we can no longer assume that the common Christian culture of old still exists. Today there are other religions that also lay claim to having the absolute truth. Pluralism today encompasses many non-Christian religions (i.e., Islam, Hinduism, Buddhism, etc.) whose numerical importance continues to grow with the arrival of new immigrants. It also includes non-believers, agnostics, atheists and those who claim to belong to no religion at all.

In view of this, we must think about the way we proclaim the Gospel today. We can't assume that a simple, objective presentation of the Gospel message will convince others of its credibility and prompt them to accept it. We must proclaim the Gospel with humility and joyful confidence listening and accepting the other person, with his or her criticisms and aggression with gentleness and reverence always aware that the ultimate goal for ourselves and those we meet is an encounter with God the Father.

May His grace be with each of us as we continue on our journey with Jesus.

St. Virgil's Evangelization Ministry

Tenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Mark 3:20-35

Last week we finished our Easter season and returned to "Ordinary Time" during which we were reading year "C," the liturgical year of Mark. In a simple phrase "Jesus came home," we feel again the humanity of Christ going home. And, "[a]gain the crowd gathered..." So, we see that Christ has moved from just a regular home-town boy, to someone Who is now different from the boy the crowd knew. Even some of his relatives could not accept this change in role and sought to "seize Him," foretelling the very term used

when the Apostle Judas would come with the soldiers to seize Him in the Garden of His agony.

How often do we reject people and their ideas just because they seem out of the ordinary? In the Gospel Christ, the teacher, goes on to try and help the crowd understand Him by telling parable stories to them. He tries to help them see that a group, or a kingdom, cannot survive if it is divided. The phrase that a house "divided against itself...will not be able to stand." Parenthetically, this is well known in our history, having been paraphrased by Lincoln during the Civil War. Here, Christ is trying, through common sense, to get the crowd to understand that good and evil cannot be working together, and that one has to disarm the evil to allow the good to survive.

In the Gospel account, more of Christ's family came to see Him, including His Mother. When told that they were there to see Him, Christ replied that we all are His family if we do "the will of God." Since He did not go out to see His Mother, some see this response as an insult to Her, but she did not take it that way. She turned to her initial acceptance of God's will for her at the Annunciation: "Let it be!" She trusted that her Son was doing God's will, and that her role was to accept that calling, just as she went on to do at Calvary. The Blessed Mother showed herself to be above petty self-conceit and accepted her role in life.

How often do we cause disagreements in a family, at work, or at social events by taking offense at something said? We put self-righteousness ahead of the "unity" that is needed. We divide our communities, instead of uniting them as Christ tried to tell the crowd. That "unity" about which He spoke, is needed to defeat evil. We can assume that among the crowd was not only His Mother, but His relative James, who went on to be the head of Church in Jerusalem after Christ's death. Thus, James seems to have absorbed Christ's lesson.

The message of Christ to the crowd and to us, is that doing the will of God is our first and most important task in life, seeking to avoid dis-unity and self-righteousness.

Lord, help is to put unity, not selfishness, first!
