## THE FOLLOWING GUIDELINES MUST BE MET IN ORDER TO SERVE AS A SPONSOR FOR BAPTISM/CONFIRMATION

Individual must:

1. have completed his or her 16th year
2. be a Catholic who has been confirmed and has already received the Sacrament of the Most Holy Eucharist and leads a life in harmony with the faith and the role to be undertaken.
3. receive the sacraments on a regular basis
4. not be bound by any Canonical penalty
5. if married, be validly married according to the norms of the church
6. not be the child's mother or father
7. obtain a letter from his/her pastor attesting to his/her eligibility to serve as a sponsor.

**ON MISSION FOR THE CHURCH ALIVE!
