**HISTORY & TRADITIONS OF MARRIAGE BANNS** - The banns of marriage, commonly known simply as the "banns" or "bans" (from a Middle English word meaning "proclamation") are the public announcement in a Christian parish church or in the town council of an impending marriage between two specified persons. Commonly associated with the Catholic Church (along with the Church of England and other denominations whose traditions are similar). In most Catholic countries these banns are still published today. The purpose of these banns is to announce the pending marriage within the parish community and to raise any canonical or civil legal impediment to the marriage, so as to prevent marriages that are invalid.

**B**rothers and Sisters in Christ,

After quite a bit of a roller-coaster ride these past few weeks with the weather, I think we're already for some summer weather. Warm and sunny days seem appropriate by the time we reach the month of June. But with the summer months comes the temptation to dress in ways that, while comfortable, may not be all that appropriate for worship of Our Lord. When we approach the Lord in His house, how do we show Him proper honor and reverence? First and foremost, through our full, active and conscious participation in the Mass. That is, we are actively engaged in the prayer of the Mass, attentive to the reality of Christ's presence among us in the Word and in the Eucharist. But we also show Our Lord reverence by our demeanor, our actions, even our attire.

This time of year, I like to offer a bit of a reminder about the proper way to dress when we come to Mass. Gone are the days when everyone dressed up in suits and dresses for Mass (though I wouldn't argue if one day we returned to that!). There was a clear message sent to the world by dressing that way: "Jesus deserves our very best!" Nowadays we tend to be much more casual in our dress. It's not uncommon to see jeans and t-shirts, even shorts and sandals, at Mass. But the way we dress reflects our attitude. We must be careful not to let the casualness of our attire cause us to become casual, lax or apathetic in our worship, for with casual dress comes the risk of irreverence and immodesty.

How are we to dress when we come to Mass? I offer here some simple norms for dressing appropriately for Mass. All attire should be:

- **Modest** – shirts, shorts and other clothing that is too revealing is inappropriate for the Mass, as it can be distracting to others and can be a temptation to those who struggle with lust. Dressing modestly is thus a safeguard for oneself as well as an act of charity to others.
- **Comfortable** – certainly, we want to be comfortable when we come to Mass. Dressing up in woolen suits would not be the most appropriate during the summer months. It's okay to dress in lighter fabrics that allow you to be comfortable.
- **Proper** – dressing for the occasion is important. When we come to Mass, we are entering into the presence of the King. Thus, what might be appropriate for the beach or a barbecue is not appropriate for the Mass. Likewise, formalwear that one might wear to a black-tie event may not be appropriate either. There is an appropriate middle ground.

Practically speaking, inappropriate clothing would include tank tops, short shorts, midriffs, tight-fitting tops or jeans, or other attire that unduly accentuates the features of the body. Surely, we all have clothing in our drawers and closets that can be worn instead.

St. Paul speaks about the need to "glorify God in your body" (1 Corinthians 6:20). He deserves only our best. We should try to "present [our] bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God" (Romans 12:1). Our attire should be pure, proper, chaste and decent. It should not call attention to ourselves. While this applies to all who come to worship at the Mass, this is particularly important for those who serve publicly in any of the altar ministries (Altar Servers, Lectors, Extraordinary Ministers). In the coming months, please enjoy all your summer activities, but please keep these guidelines in mind as we gather for worship. Remember, we come before Our Lord to receive Him in the Most Holy Eucharist. He is most humble as He offers Himself to us – we should be humble and reverent in return.
