The Rosary

The Virgin Mary gave the Rosary to St. Dominic, along with 15 Promises for those reciting it. The Promises to Rosary devotees include special protection during and at the end of life, great graces, God's abundant mercy, receive the sacraments before death, have for intercessors the entire celestial court during life and death, and merit a high degree of glory in Heaven.



Why would we pray the rosary daily? Catholics pray the rosary because it's a powerful prayer to God, through His mother and because Our Blessed Mother asks us to pray it daily. The Blessed Mother knows what's in store for mankind in the future – the good and the bad. So when she gives an urgent message to pray the rosary for her intentions, she knows the good that the rosary can accomplish in alleviating evil in the world.

In various apparitions, Mary has appeared holding a rosary and has asked that we continue to pray this prayer. At Fatima, Portugal, Mary called herself "Our Lady of the Rosary." During all six apparitions in 1917, Our Lady asked: "Pray the Rosary every day." She always leads us to her Son, and presents our needs before Him.

The Blessed Mother told Fr. Stefano Gobbi, in his book *Marian Movement of Priests*, that "The Rosary is the weapon that I give to these children of mine to fight the great approaching battles which awaits them."

Fr. Patrick Peyton, an Irishman known as the Rosary Priest, dedicated his life to serving God by bringing a message of hope to families around the world. His love for Jesus and Mary fueled his desire to share the fruits of family Rosary prayer every waking moment of his priestly life. Attributed to him is the phrase, "The family that prays together stays together." The family Rosary is a source of good for everyone, for it attracts God's mercy to the home.

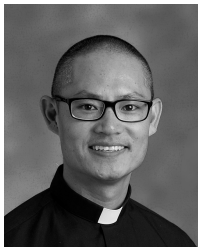
Pope St. Pius X said, "If you wish peace to reign in your homes, recite the family Rosary."

I really began praying the rosary in high school. My best friend's family was Irish and devout Catholic, and his entire family would pray the rosary on their knees every night at 6:45pm, listening to a priest leading the rosary on the radio. When I was visiting my buddy at that hour, I would get on my knees and join them. That was my introduction to the family rosary.

In 1992, I started a weekly rosary group at the Atrium. I have prayed the rosary almost every day since then, and it is a priority in my life. Today, I lead the rosary three mornings a week after Mass here at Holy Family. I trust that God and the Blessed Mother hear every prayer and prayer request that I say.

One way I sometimes pray the Rosary is to spiritually give a rose to the Blessed Mother for every Hail Mary that I say. She places the individual roses in a basket. At the end of the rosary, she will take the basket full of roses and present them to Jesus along with my intentions. How can Jesus refuse to accept this gift from His Mother!

A Message From Our Pastor

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As evidenced by the work that we are seeing with our parking lot, we have come to completion of what we hope to get done as promised in January 2016. Recalling the beginning of the year, we added \$30,000 on top of our usual Annual Diocesan Appeal (ADA). Thanks to the 628 families who pledged, we have reached both our ADA goal and the challenge goal for the resealing of our parking lot. As of now, we have collected \$187,209 which is enough for the ADA itself. We still have more than \$30,000 pledged which is coming in by monthly installment to fulfill our challenge goal. Because we had to get our parking lot resealed before the school year began, I asked our finance department to borrow from another source to complete the project. Once the rest of the pledges are collected we will pay off our loan. In other words, speaking of the parking lot resealing project alone we are done. Thanks be to God and to our families who made this possible.

Next, as I have mentioned, resealing was dependent upon the removal of the speed bumps (tripping hazards) and replacing them with the speed humps as we had to complete this or we would have to pay twice as much if the parking resealing and bumps were done separately. This separate project is also nicely done and it is on loan as well. We have another urgent project—the removal of the wooden ramp and replacement with a concrete ramp. This has to be done before winter as the wooden ramp is a tripping hazard—very slippery during winter season. Along with this are other projects that we would like to get done as soon as possible: 1) replacement of our main sign on Pearl Ave; 2) the installment of a Cross on our main door entrance; and 3) the community center’s kitchen renovation. These five projects will cost us \$150,000. The tougher challenge is that we need to have the funds on hand by the end of August this year. I am confident that with God’s grace along with your support and prayers we will once again achieve this goal by the end of August. I will continue to keep the community posted. Please respond graciously accordingly to your means when you hear from me. Thanks much in advance.

As I am aggressively working toward getting the work done as its nature has mandated of me, please also keep me in your prayers. As always, you all are in my daily prayers.

May the Lord in His love and goodness continues to bless our community and our upcoming projects.
