Anointing of the Sick

Anointing of the sick is one of the two Sacraments of Healing in our Catholic faith, the other being the Sacrament of Penance or Reconciliation. The Sacrament of Anointing of the sick is typically received when you are in danger of death due to serious illness or advanced age. Anointing of the sick is a sacrament that can be received by any baptized Catholic having reached the age of reason.

The Anointing of the Sick “is not a sacrament for those only who are at the point of death. Hence as soon as anyone of the faithful begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, the fitting time to receive this sacrament has certainly already arrived.”

—Catechism of the Catholic Church, no. 1514, citing SC, no. 73



Anointing of the Sick is an often misunderstood sacrament. It is not a “one time” or “deathbed” sacrament. Vatican II taught that the faithful should know they are to ask for this sacrament each time they fall seriously ill. For some of us with weakened immune systems or the very young or very old even the flu is dangerous, and we should be anointed. One should also receive the sacrament before going into the hospital to undergo surgery. In addition to physical ailment, we now know that this sacrament can give graces to those suffering with mental illnesses. The priest may give the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick to a person at any place or time, however, it may also be given during Mass.

During the rite, Father will pray a litany with those assembled, and will pray over each of those who desire the sacrament. Then he will anoint each individually with the oil for the Anointing of the Sick. This is one of the three oils that are blessed by the Bishop during the Chrism Mass during Lent.

First, he anoints the forehead saying, “Through this holy anointing may the Lord in his love and mercy help you with the grace of the Holy Spirit.” And the anointed will reply, “Amen”. Then, he anoints the hands saying, “May the Lord who frees you from sin save you and raise you up.” And the anointed will again reply, “Amen”.

The prayer after anointing gives us insight into what we are hoping this sacrament will confer on those who are anointed. The priest prays:

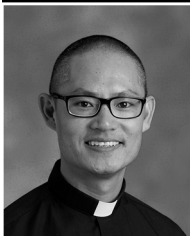
*Father in heaven,
Through this holy anointing
Grant these sisters and brothers comfort in their suffering.*

*When they are afraid, give them courage,
When afflicted, give them patience,
When dejected, afford them hope,
And when alone, assure them of the support of your holy people.*

Through the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick, we hope that we will receive bodily healing, if that is the will of God. Furthermore, this sacrament confers many graces. Anointing of the Sick unites the sick person to the passion of Christ, it gives strength, peace and courage to endure sufferings, it imparts the forgiveness of sins if the Sacrament of Penance was unable to be received and it helps prepare for the passing over to eternal life.

At Holy Family, we are going to begin offering Anointing of the Sick at weekend Masses approximately once every 3 months. *All who need this sacrament should ask for it. If you're unsure if your illness is serious enough it probably is but if you need assistance discerning a Priest is always happy to talk with you.* Our first opportunity to receive this sacrament in community will be **June 17th at 5:30pm Mass.**

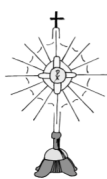

The Mass

Introductory Rites cont'd:

The last part of the Introductory Rites is the Collect.

Father says, "Let us Pray." Then there should be a respectable pause and plenty of silence. This is where all the people together, in silence together we lift our prayers to God. Once that pause has been accomplished and we have had an opportunity to pray in silence, Father "collects" all our prayers together, and with his hands outstretched in the "Orans" position he concludes our silent prayer.

Speaking of the "orans" position, that is where Father stands with elbows and wrists bent, palms facing upwards at about shoulder height. This is the position, reserved for the priest (and only the celebrant of the Mass if there are multiple priests present) which signifies to us that he is praying to God on our behalf. When the priest holds his hands in this position, we should hold our hands pressed together, fingers pointing upward, in prayer position. Watch the Deacon and concelebrants, this is how they hold their hands during the prayers.

After the Collect, we transition to the Liturgy of the Word, so we sit.

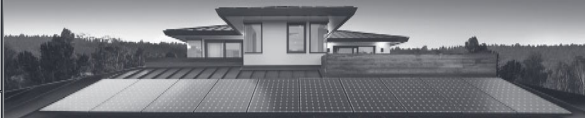
