Bring Alongs and Leave Behinds

Appropriate Dress

Dress at both the program and worksites should be casual but modest, i.e., jeans or long shorts, shirts/t-shirts, and tennis shoes.

Dress Code

- All shirts must have sleeves and be long enough to be tucked in.
- Shoes or sandals must be worn at all times (for safety and health).
- Shorts should be mid-thigh length (gym shorts are great).
- Have closed-toe shoes for worksites (some worksites require this).

Not Allowed (please leave home)

- short-shorts
- t-shirts with suggestive or violent language
- strapless tops
- cut-off t-shirts
- extra baggy clothing

This conservative approach to dress is taken with an awareness of the summer sun's strength and respect for other cultures' sensitivity to proper attire.

Anyone working outdoors for most or even part of the day should wear a hat. Participants involved in repair or construction work shouldn't wear sandals or open-toe shoes and may want to wear jeans instead of shorts.
