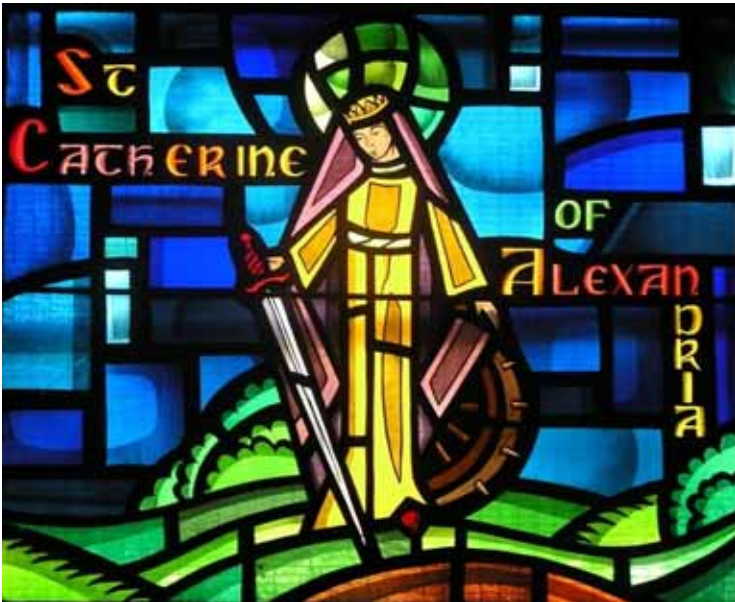

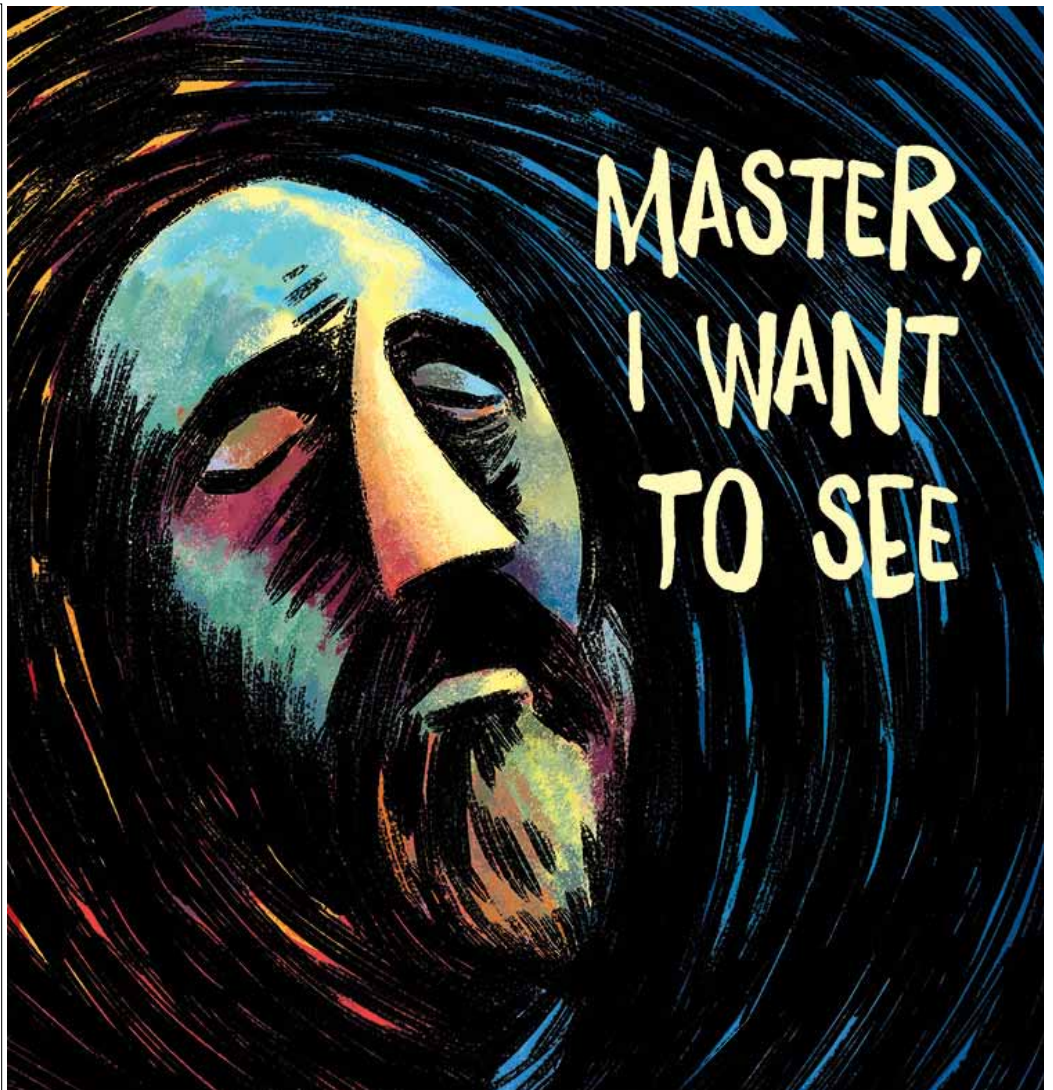

## STEWARDSHIP IN SCRIPTURE

Blind Bartimaeus, we may not remember his name but surely having his sight restored is not something we forget. Sight is such a central physical capability but one which is taken for granted until we have difficulty seeing. Eyeglasses are so prevalent that we forget how life giving they are. Each of us has differing levels of visual acuity, some never need glasses but many of us do. Seeing clearly is indeed a gift, focus permits us to interpret what we see with clarity, letting us concentrate on what the meaning of our sight has brought to us. This is an excellent metaphor for our spiritual vision. Unfortunately some are spiritually blind, having no belief or understanding of our creator and our savior, not realizing that their spiritual vision is important and able to be corrected. Just as with out physical sight, we need "glasses" to give us clarity in our relationship with God. Ideally our spiritual glasses are our own, we've developed habits of prayer, worship and love that guide us as we journey. But sometimes we need the help of a guide, someone or something which re-centers us. The guide may be someone we know who inspires us and supplies guidance when our "vision" seems to fail. Certainly the most present guide is our Lord Jesus. He is always with us, calling gently to the path of our true journey back to our creator God. A difficulty can arise when we think that we're "in charge" of our spiritual journey. We forget that revelation, those spiritual "aha" moments, are ever offering new and important insights as we journey. We can go so far as to say that, like "mature" folks who need reading glasses pretty universally, our spiritual close vision also needs attention. When Jesus calls us to love one another, we need to ensure that we "see" others as Jesus does... as worthy and loved, even if unliked. Perhaps we need to think of the example of Bartimaeus who could have answered Jesus' question "*What do you want me to do for you?*" in any number of ways but chose sight as his most essential need, not money or success or stature or ... you get the idea. Just as we need to visit the eye doctor regularly to ensure that we see well, we also need to answer Jesus, "*I want to see.*" Regular visits to church allow us to ask for spiritual vision correction. The Word and Eucharist provide spiritual nourishment and vision more essential than our own perceived needs. Wanting to see requires more than just glasses; we need help in knowing how we should sharpen our focus. Having glasses in only a part of the solution, we need to know on what to focus ... Jesus.

## Pastor Installation

Next week, on Saturday, November the 3rd, we will have the "Mass of Installation of a Pastor." But what is it? And what is the meaning of that "installation?" When a priest is assigned to a new parish as its pastor, he receives a letter from the bishop informing him about new assignment. The letter notes the date that the assignment begins and, all things being equal, the day the assignment will end.

But there is a special day on which the bishop himself comes to the parish to introduce the new pastor to the community in a formal way, asking for the prayers and support of the whole congregation. This is to make public what everyone in the parish should already know: that the pastor has the full confidence and support of the bishop and that the community, the parish, is entrusted to the new pastor and that as the shepherd of the parish, he is responsible for the spiritual wellbeing of the flock.

Canon 519 describes the office of pastor in these words: *The parish priest is the proper pastor of the parish entrusted to him. He exercises the pastoral care of the community entrusted to him under the authority of the diocesan Bishop, whose ministry of Christ he is called to share, so that for this community he may carry out the offices of teaching, sanctifying and ruling with the cooperation of other priests or deacons and with the assistance of lay members of Christ's faithful, in accordance with the law.*

At Mass of Installation, other priests are usually present to concelebrate and to show their comradery, friendship and support of the new pastor and of the parish.

During the Mass, after the Dean reads the letter of appointment, the new pastor preaches about his hope and dreams for the parish. He then promises to exercise his ministry in service of, and collaboration with, the People of God that make up the parish. The pastor then leads the assembly in reciting the Profession of Faith and adds his pledge of union and fidelity to the Magisterium of the Church, to the Holy Father and to the Bishop.

This is a key part of the Rite of Installation, in that it expresses in simple terms the unity of the universal Church, the local Church (Diocese) and the Parish. Although the parish is a relatively small part of the Church throughout the world, its unity with the whole Church is part of its DNA, its very identity.

As your pastor, I ask you to keep me in your prayers that for as long as I will be your pastor I will be able to show to each of you the face of our Lord who is the true Pastor, the Good Shepherd.

DESDE EL ESCRITORIO DEL P. SERGIO OVANDO, PARROCO.....

Instalación del Párroco

La próxima semana, el sábado 3 de noviembre, tendremos la "Misa de instalación de un Párroco". ¿Pero qué es? ¿Y cuál es el significado de esa "instalación"? Cuando un sacerdote es asignado a una nueva parroquia como su Párroco, él recibe una carta del Obispo informándole sobre su nuevo destino. La carta anota la fecha en que comienza su labor pastoral y cuando termina.

Pero hay un día especial en el que el Obispo mismo viene a la parroquia para presentar al nuevo Párroco a la comunidad de una manera formal, pidiendo las oraciones y el apoyo de toda la congregación. Esto es para hacer público lo que todos en la parroquia ya deben saber: que el Párroco tiene plena confianza y apoyo del Obispo y que la comunidad, la parroquia, se confía al nuevo Párroco y que, como Párroco es responsable del bienestar espiritual del rebaño.

**Canon 519:** *El párroco es el pastor propio de la parroquia que se le confía, y ejerce la cura pastoral de la comunidad que le está encomendada bajo la autoridad del Obispo diocesano en cuyo ministerio de Cristo ha sido llamado a participar, para que en esa misma comunidad cumpla las funciones de enseñar, santificar y regir, con la cooperación también de otros presbíteros o diáconos, y con la ayuda de fieles laicos, conforme a la norma del derecho.*

En la misa de instalación, otros sacerdotes suelen estar presentes para concelebrar y mostrar su camaradería, amistad y apoyo al nuevo Párroco y a la parroquia.

Durante la misa, después que el decano lee la carta de nombramiento, el nuevo Párroco predica sobre su esperanza y sus sueños para la parroquia. Luego promete ejercer su ministerio al servicio y en colaboración con el Pueblo de Dios que conforma la parroquia. El pastor luego dirige la asamblea a recitar la Profesión de Fe y agrega su promesa de unión y fidelidad al Magisterio de la Iglesia, al Santo Padre y al Obispo. Esta es una parte clave del Rito de Instalación, ya que expresa en términos simples la unidad de la Iglesia universal, la Iglesia local (Diócesis) y la Parroquia. Aunque la parroquia es una parte relativamente pequeña de la Iglesia en todo el mundo, su unidad con toda la Iglesia es parte de su ADN, su identidad.

Como su Párroco, le pido que me mantenga en sus oraciones para que, mientras yo sea su Párroco, pueda mostrarle a cada uno de ustedes el rostro de nuestro Señor, que es el verdadero Pastor, el Buen Pastor.

## TRIGESIMO DOMINGO DEL TIEMPO ORDINARIO

### OBRANDO EN LAS ESCRITURAS

El ciego Bartimeo, es posible que no recordemos su nombre, pero que haya recuperado la vista no es algo que olvidemos. La vista es una capacidad física tan central, pero es algo que subestimamos hasta que tenemos dificultades para ver. Los lentes son tan frecuentes que nos olvidamos de lo importantes que son. Cada uno de nosotros tiene diferentes niveles de agudeza visual, algunos nunca necesitan lentes, pero muchos de nosotros sí. Ver claramente es ciertamente un regalo, el enfoque nos permite interpretar lo que vemos con claridad. Esta es una excelente metáfora de nuestra visión espiritual. Desafortunadamente, algunos son espiritualmente ciegos, no tienen ninguna creencia o comprensión de nuestro creador y nuestro salvador, sin darse cuenta de que su visión espiritual es importante y puede ser corregida. Al igual que con nuestra vista física, necesitamos "lentes" para tener claridad en nuestra relación con Dios. Idealmente, nuestros lentes espirituales son los nuestros, hemos desarrollado hábitos de oración, adoración y amor que nos guían en nuestro viaje. Pero a veces necesitamos la ayuda de un guía, alguien o algo que nos vuelva a centrar. La guía puede ser alguien que conocemos que nos inspira y proporciona orientación cuando nuestra "visión" parece fallar. Ciertamente la guía más presente es nuestro Señor Jesús. Él siempre está con nosotros, llamándonos suavemente al camino de nuestro verdadero viaje de regreso a nuestro Dios creador. Puede surgir una dificultad cuando pensamos que estamos "a cargo" de nuestro viaje espiritual. Olvidamos que la revelación, esos momentos espirituales de "¡aha!", ofrecen nuevas e importantes ideas a medida que avanzamos. Podemos ir tan lejos como para decir que, al igual que las personas "mayores" que necesitan anteojos para leer usualmente, nuestra visión espiritual también necesita atención. Cuando Jesús nos llama a amarnos unos a otros, debemos asegurarnos de que "veamos" a los demás como lo hace Jesús ... como dignos y amados, incluso si no nos gusta. Tal vez debamos pensar en el ejemplo de Bartimeo, que pudo haber respondido a la pregunta de Jesús "¿Qué quieres que haga por ti?" De muchas maneras, pero escogió la vista como su necesidad más esencial, no como dinero o éxito. ¿Entiende la idea? Así como necesitamos visitar al oculista con regularidad para asegurarnos de que veamos bien, también debemos responder a Jesús: "Quiero ver". Las visitas regulares a la iglesia nos permiten solicitar la corrección de la visión espiritual. La Palabra de Dios y la Eucaristía proporcionan alimento espiritual y visión más esenciales que nuestras propias necesidades percibidas. Querer ver requiere algo más que lentes; Necesitamos ayuda para saber cómo debemos enfocarnos. Tener lentes es solamente una parte de la solución, necesitamos saber en qué enfocarnos ... en Jesús.

### MESSGAE FROM THE DIOCESE

*This week Bishop McGrath released the list of all clergy with credible allegations of sexual misconduct with children within the Diocese of San Jose. Bishop expresses his deepest apologies for the actions of those who were in positions of authority and who violated that sacred trust by abusing children.*

*In the bulletin, you'll find a link to the Bishop's full statement, the List and FAQs and on the Diocesan Website. The List demonstrates there were errors of judgment in how the Church and its leadership dealt with these cases before the Dallas Charter in 2002. Some of those errors in judgment were based on professional psychological standards at the time; some of the errors were based on moving too slowly as we tried to find some verification of the allegations. The only way to move forward is to clean the wound fully.*

*We encourage any survivors, who have not previously come forward, to do so by contacting the local authorities – police department or sheriff's office – and then to make a report to our Office for the Protection of Children the information is in the bulletin. The identities of victims are always kept confidential. We all – the clergy and the laity - need to know the truth, the full truth, to bring healing to the victims and their families.*

*Since 2002, we have worked diligently to create a safe environment in which to worship, learn, and gather in our parishes, schools and other institutions. Every bishop, priest, deacon, employee, and volunteer, who has contact with children in any capacity, must undergo a background check and training on how to prevent, recognize and report the sexual abuse of children that must be renewed every three years. We will continue to improve upon these efforts.*
