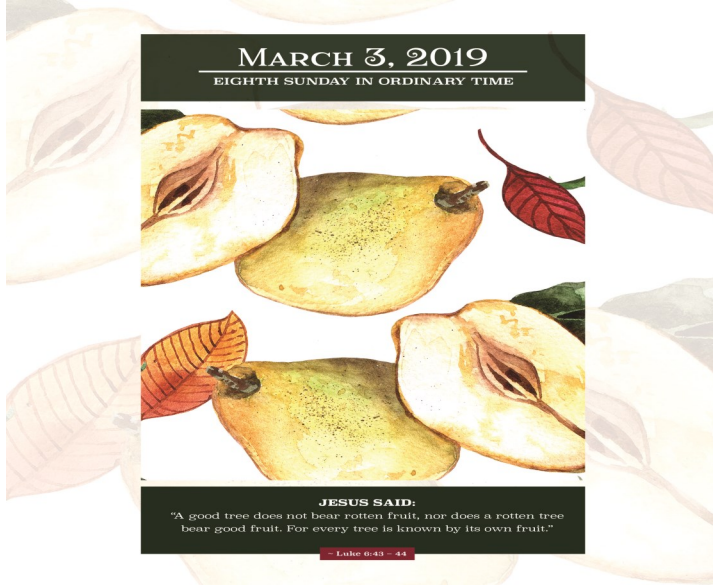

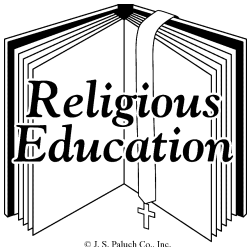

From the desk of your pastor, Fr. Andy "8th Week of Ordinary Time"

March 3, 2019

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

For the last 7 weeks we have been recovering from the holy and hectic seasons of Advent and Christmas. We have been listening to the teaching, healing and calling gospels, the Good News of Jesus Christ. We have been, hopefully, resting AND getting ready for what is now about to begin.

This week, on Wednesday, many people, Catholic and non-Catholic alike, will visit churches all over the world to be marked with ashes to begin the holy, happy and glorious season of preparation known as Lent. While Ash Wednesday is not necessarily a holy day of obligation, we in church work seem to see a huge influx of faithful and just interested people who visit churches and are marked with ashes. This is a good thing. This marking is an opportunity for ALL to think about one of the formulae that are used when we are marked. Many remember, "Remember child of God, you are dust and to dust you shall return," as the primary prayer prayed over someone who is marked with ashes. There are other formulae that are also used: "Repent and listen to the gospel," and, "Turn away from sin and hear the Good News," are also used as possible meditations for people who come to begin this holy season. All these meditations are good for us to consider as we begin Lent.

The gospel for this weekend is another way to consider preparing for Lent this year too. When we hear, Jesus instructing the disciples regarding the splinter in your brother's eye, "You hypocrite, remove the wooden beam from your eye first; then you will see clearly to remove the splinter in your brother's eye." This admonition is one way of knowing we need to address our own short fallings BEFORE we try and correct those others' faults. This would be a great Lenten practice to consider.

This week, as we begin Lent, let's do so by joyfully engaging in a sense of happy sacrifice that will help us with our preparations for Easter. May we take these days of Lent to engage at a deeper level into the possibilities of what we can gain spiritually and physically as we turn our hearts away from sin and embrace the opportunity to grow as people of faith.

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence.

For members of the Latin Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.
