Dear Parishioners of Saint Clare, Holy Spirit, Thomas à Becket and Saint Elizabeth Parishes:

It is my sad duty to share with you that an accusation was received through the Independent Reconciliation and Compensation Program that your priest-administrator, Father Robert Cedolia, allegedly sexually abused a minor in the 1990s, while he served as pastor of Our Lady of Joy Parish in Holiday Park. Father Cedolia has vehemently denied sexually abusing anyone. Prior to this, no other allegation of sexual abuse against Father Cedolia has come to the diocese. Father Cedolia has been a priest in active ministry for 41 years.

In response to this allegation, and in accordance with the *Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People* of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops and the policies of the Diocese of Pittsburgh, Father Cedolia has been placed on administrative leave. Removing Father Cedolia from ministry does not imply guilt. It is intended to safeguard the course of justice while preserving the rights of everyone involved, including both the person against whom an allegation has been made and the person who made the allegation.

When such an allegation has been made, Church law and diocesan policy mandate specific procedures. One is to immediately notify the appropriate civil authorities, which has been done. Another is to bring the information before the Independent Review Board, which will advise me on whether Father Cedolia is suitable for future ministry.

Father Cedolia has taken up a temporary residence while this allegation is looked into further. While he is on administrative leave he is not allowed to engage in public ministry. He cannot administer the sacraments, dress in clerical attire or identify himself as a priest. If a determination is made that Father Cedolia did what he is accused of, those restrictions will become permanent. If it is determined that the allegation is unfounded, all that is possible will be done to restore Father Cedolia's reputation and return him to ministry.

If you have information that could shed further light on this matter, please call the diocesan Victim Assistance Coordinator at 1-888-808-1235 or contact the civil authorities. Anyone who has been harmed by someone representing the Church should inform the diocese so that we can protect others and offer healing.

Please be assured that, as this matter moves forward, I will continue to provide your parishes with pastoral care. I have appointed Father Fred Cain, regional vicar of Vicariate II, to serve as temporary administrator of the parishes in your grouping.

Recognizing that this is a painful time for everyone concerned, I ask that you join me in praying for the person who has brought this allegation forward, for Father Cedolia, for those who will help make a determination in this matter and for me, your bishop. We need to support one another in the days ahead. Please know how much I am praying for you, the faithful in the Clairton/Jefferson Hills/Pleasant Hills/West Mifflin grouping, during this difficult time. May our words, our deeds and our prayers always reflect the healing love of Jesus.
