

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I hope you had a blessed Christmas, a wonderful beginning to the new year.

As you may have heard, I will be leading a pilgrimage to the Holy Land from January 2<sup>nd</sup> through the 12<sup>th</sup>. The pilgrimage is done through the company 206 Tours, a Catholic company specializing in pilgrimage travel. I've been to the Holy Land before, but this will be my first time leading a group of pilgrims as chaplain. I'm considering offering a similar pilgrimage here at Holy Family, so please do let me know if this is something you might be interested in, in the future.

One of the blessings of a trip to the Holy Land is being able to see and hear and smell and touch the places where our Lord lived and ministered. Most especially, visiting the Holy Sepulchre church in which are the rock of Calvary where our Lord was crucified, and the Holy Tomb where he was buried, are experiences that can powerfully affect how we experience Holy Week and the mysteries of our faith, forever.

With all the holiday celebrations the last couple weeks, it can be easy to let the religious part of the season blend into the overall feeling of the holiday, one that can seem at times more like mythology. We hear about the stories of our faith so often, that it can be easy to take them for granted, and they risk becoming simply that: stories. But by experiencing the wonder of the Holy Land, we recall how Christianity is not a story, but a fact of history. The mysteries of our faith happened, and men and women saw them as we see the events of history before us today: and even more intimately, without the means of radio, television, or the internet.

Touching the rock upon which Jesus died, feeling the stone that covered his tomb, one is reminded how our faith is just as real and pressing in our own life: both its demands and claims, but even more the peace and the hope and the joy it brings – not just feelings, but tangible effects of what our Savior accomplished two thousand years ago.

In downtown DC, National Geographic has an impressive museum on the Tomb of Christ. Even if you can't make a trip to the Holy Land, seeing this museum is a great way to feel the tangible reality of our faith. I highly recommend it.


