It is hard to imagine any merely human prudence or wisdom conjuring up the radical propositions of the Sermon on the Mount. While Jesus does not intend to abolish the Old Law, he promises to fulfill or realize the law in a new way, utterly at odds with the secular and religious rulers of his time. "I tell you, unless your holiness surpasses that of the scribes and Pharisees you shall not enter the kingdom of God." Murder had already been forbidden in the Ten Commandments, but Jesus plumbs to the heart of murderous intent. It is unspoken anger, violent language, quiet contempt of the other. It is an unwillingness to forgive. How different would our own Eucharists be if we took Jesus seriously? The resentments we hold against others would have to dissolve before we would approach the altar, lest we receive the sacrament unworthily. Perhaps that is why our Communion is aptly prefaced by the sign of peace. Adultery was forbid-

den of old. But Jesus speaks to the lust that underlies the adultery, and unmasks the injustice, especially against women, that so often accompany divorce. It can be dangerous, mind-altering, to read the Sermon on the Mount. It will shake the ways we think about punishment, penalty, justice, and love itself. Most of all it thwarts our attempts to compromise our faith or set aside privileged parts of our lives that we shield from the law of God. We all are called to holiness, and therefore we must not exempt ourselves. The Sermon on the Mount is not there to cast us down into helpless and hopeless guilt. It is an invitation to that high holiness that we have hitherto not seen or heard about. Journeying through the gospels is no easy trip. Anyone who leaves church without having witnessed the radicalness of the Mass and the revolutionary import of the gospel was asleep.

GOSPEL REFLECTION

Today Jesus reminds us that following the letter of the law may give us a false sense of holiness. Jesus drills down to the root of the Law in several examples. While we may have not murdered anyone, Jesus asks if we have acted in anger toward others. Do we perceive others as objects of gratification rather than dignified persons created in the image of God? Are others treated as commodities or servants rather than one to whom I am pledged or called to serve? What are the motives behind our actions? Are they good and holy? We are not called to simply observe the letter of the Law but the spirit too.
