Do you think that I have come to establish peace on the earth? (Luke 12:51)

Well, yes, as a matter of fact. Didn’t Isaiah announce the coming of the “Prince of Peace” (9-5). Of course he came to establish peace on earth! That may be true but at the same time, the aged Simeon prophesied that Jesus would be “a sign that will be contradicted”. (Luke 2:34). In fact, Jesus’ entire public life seemed to be marked by division and controversy. So is Jesus a source of peace? Or is he a source of division? He’s both. Jesus knows that not everyone will embrace his message and the peace that comes with it. He also knows that divisions will arise because of this. On a grand scale, we have seen this in religious conflicts around the globe. And on a more intimate scale, we see this in many families. On the one hand are those who have accepted Jesus and the blessings of his salvation. On the other hand are those who have yet to embrace the salvation that Jesus came to bring. At times, the differences can be so strong as to cause conflict and separation. Jesus is the Prince of Peace because he came to bring peace to our divided hearts. And as our own divided hearts are healed, we learn how to love as he loves and how to forgive as he forgives. Only Jesus’ love and forgiveness can bring unity.
