Ohio Honors Diploma Requirements

Seniors must meet seven of the eight requirements.

English	4 units
Mathematics	4 units, including Algebra I, Geometry, Algebra II or the equivalent and another higher level course or a four-year sequence of courses that contain equivalent content
Science	4 units, including chemistry and another advanced course
Social Studies	4 units
Foreign Language	3 units (must include no less than 2 units for which credit is sought), i.e., 3 units of one language or 2 units each of two languages
Fine Arts	1 unit
ACT/SAT Score [excluding scores from the writing sections]*	27 ACT / 1210 SAT
Grade Point Average	3.5 on a 4.0 scale

End of Course Exams

Freshmen - Algebra I & English Language Arts I

Sophomores - Geometry, English Language Arts II, American History, Biology

Juniors - American Government

Students must score 18 points on the end of course exams to graduate. Each exam is scored from one to five. Students who earn a one or a two must retake exams until they reach the 18 points required.
