Dear parishioners,

The readings today are troubling. If we don't tell people what God wants and they don't turn their lives around, God will hold us responsible. I am occasionally asked, "What will happen to people who never had a chance to be baptized?" My response is, "I don't know, but I wonder if they will be responsible or if I will be for not going out to the ends of the earth and making disciples."

In our culture we are so pressured to be politically correct. We are not supposed to criticize anyone for their life choices. Even more, we are barely permitted to speak our own beliefs and values without someone jumping down our throats!

I am amazed when young couples come in to prepare for marriage who are already living together. They will often say their parents are fine with this arrangement. Interesting.

I don't believe we need to hop up on a soapbox and start preaching right and wrong. There may be a time you are called upon to do that. Generally, we need to speak up when the situation arises—whether or not your belief is popular. The gospel says to first go alone to tell your brother when he sins against you. It doesn't say to gossip about him first. It doesn't say to gang up on him with an entourage. Talk to him/her one-on-one first. If that doesn't work, take two or three witnesses with you. If that doesn't work, tell the church.

I don't know that I have that kind of integrity and courage. It IS what Jesus calls us to—to confront evil. Let's pray we can do what is needed when it needs to be done.
