Dear parishioners,

Pope Francis says in his apostolic exhortation "*Evangelii Gaudium*"

"The great danger in today's world, pervaded as it is by consumerism, is the desolation and anguish born of a complacent yet covetous heart, the feverish pursuit of frivolous pleasures, and a blunted conscience."

All of that is profoundly true. All those characteristics have crept into our practice of the faith as well. Many people treat parish and church and religion as if it were a store where you can consume goods at your pleasure. If we don't like what is offered in one place we go to shop in another. How many times have we heard someone say they left their parish because the music wasn't good, the homilies weren't interesting, the Masses were not at a good time, there wasn't enough for children to do.... None of that has to do with commitment either to God or to our brother and sisters in the parish. It has to do with what I want—consumerism.

Only occasionally do we hear someone offer to head up a program or volunteer to help. We want the service, but we don't want to have to take responsibility to make it happen. These are signs of "a complacent yet covetous heart."

There is a dearth of commitment in our culture. We don't want to commit because something better might come along, and we are good at making excuses when we don't keep our word. We're so good at "forgetting" or being "so busy" or "so stressed" or having so many activities for our children that there is little room for family, service or faith.

This might be a good day to examine my life and see if I am complacent, covetous, desolate, pursuing frivolous pleasures, or allowing a blunted conscience. Let's be more true to our word and to our commitments.

Paris Owens' grandfather, Henry Owens, fought with his father and three brothers in the White Boy Rebellion in Ireland in 1798. This was an uprising against the oppression of farmers and Catholics. Henry's father and two brothers were captured and executed. Henry and one brother escaped and migrated to the United States. When they arrived, Henry lost his brother and never saw him again.
