Dear parishioners,

Sometimes we overlook the wealth we have available to us in the writings of those who came before us. St. Bonaventure was born in the 13th century just shortly before St. Francis of Assisi died. Bonaventure was a great theologian, a bishop, a cardinal and the 7th minister (leader) of the Franciscan order. So, yes, he was a Franciscan and therefore my bias.

Here is what Bonaventure wrote about the time before Jesus' coming:

It was most fitting...that prophets with many testimonies, both explicit in words and implicit in figures, should precede the coming of Christ. By these numerous and powerful witnesses, what had been hidden became clear and unquestionable for belief. Repeated promises and intense desires also were to precede the coming of Christ so that the promised benefit would be expected, that what was expected was long-awaited, that what was long-awaited would be more intensely desired, and that what was more intensely desired would be loved more fervently, received more gratefully, and heeded with greater care.

The Church is wise in giving us the season of Advent—for all the reasons that Bonaventure gives. Because we take four weeks to prepare for Christmas, it will be more expected, desired, loved, heeded. We know that about our experience of shopping for gifts, baking, decorating. Do we take Advent seriously as a time for preparing our minds and hearts so that Jesus' birth will also be more expected, desired, loved, heeded?
