Dear parishioners,

Today is Vocation Sunday. It is a day to pray for vocations. It's also a day to think about vocations.

A vocation is a call. The word "vocation" comes from the Latin word "vocare" – to call. When you call on someone, you expect a response. When a teacher calls on a student, he/she expects an answer. When you call someone to the stage, you expect the person to come forward. When you call someone on the phone, you hope that person will answer.

God calls each of us in many ways: to a vocation, to a state in life, to a mission, to service. The crux is to be listening for the call. And the foundation of that is to believe that each of us is called. God has not given us life for ourselves. God has a plan for us to help with God's plan. Our personality, our gifts, our interests have all been given to us for a purpose. We need to believe in the Good Shepherd, and we need to know the voice of the Shepherd. Saint Augustine states "You have made us for yourself, O Lord, and our heart is restless until it rests in you." Our way to real happiness is to be and do what God wishes for us.

How many times do we say, "What do you want me to do, God? What do you want me to be? Show me the way." Today is a good day to say that prayer. Today is a good day to look into your heart to listen to where you might be called. Today might be a good day for you who are parents to talk to your children about a vocation to be a priest or sister or brother or single person or married person. Vocations don't usually grow to fruition without encouragement.
