RESPONSIBLE PARENTHOOD

Pope Francis created quite a stir in his reference to rabbits during what has become the customary press conference on the return flight to Rome from the Philippines. It will be helpful to understand the context. The Philippines now has a population of 100 million, more than 80% of whom are Catholics. Just a few months ago, the national legislature with leadership from the president adopted a bill that permits the use of contraceptives and calls for mandatory sex education in public schools. This legislation was, of course, vigorously fought against by the nation's Catholic bishops. While Francis was visiting, it was widely publicized that a rather large population of homeless children in the Manila area were rounded up and kept out of sight. The truth is that the poverty rate in the Philippines is very high, and many government officials made no apologies in stating that the unavailability of contraceptives was a contributing

One of the reporters on the plane asked the Pope for his position on the whole matter of birth control for Catholics. Francis first of all rejected the idea that poverty is caused by the number of children that parents choose to bring into the world. He said it is rather caused by an unjust economic system which fails to place the fundamental rights and needs of human beings at its center. Then he added that unlike rabbits, Catholics are not obliged to have one child after another, but rather using licit means of family planning, are able to limit the number of children as a feature of responsible parenthood. Now we all know that Pope Francis has become loved and admired because he speaks so plainly rather than in theological jargon. But the reference to rabbits is one that all are familiar with so he chose that to drive home his point. Some Catholics took offense claiming that he was criticizing large families. These individuals must not have known that only a few weeks ago Pope Francis had convened a gathering at the Vatican to celebrate large families!

The truth is that the world faces predictable dangers from both overpopulation (in the *Third World*), and underpopulation (in the so-called Developed World). Many of the richest nations on earth are contending with birth rates that have fallen way below the replacement rate (more births than deaths). It is also true that most well educated people, Catholic and non-Catholics alike, believe that determining the number of children that couples have is a personal matter based on the conviction of each. While the Pope no doubt acknowledges this choice as a highly personal one, he believes there are gospel principles which the church's teachers have an obligation to point out. One might fairly ask: Does wishing to have a "better" life style justify not being generous in bringing new life into the world?


