**ARCHDIOCESAN CAMPAIGN  
 PLANNING STUDY E-SURVEY**

This is an exciting time in the Archdiocese of Oklahoma City. After a great deal of prayer and consultation, Archbishop Coakley has begun planning for the first major fundraising campaign in the history of the Archdiocese.

As part of the planning process, a campaign planning study is underway and we want your input and opinions. After receiving the above announcement, I had a meeting with Mark Berlin, a representative of the fundraising company hired by the Archdiocese to discuss the upcoming capital campaign in greater detail. I noted that the plan seems enormously ambitious in its scope and expressed the hope that it would be reviewed very carefully to determine what we could realistically hope to achieve. He assured me that after completing their consultations with pastors and laity, they would be able to recommend to the Archbishop a campaign that would result in great success.

I hope we could all agree that providing a beautiful Shrine for the remains of Priest & Martyr Father Stanley Rother is a fitting centerpiece of the capital campaign. His dedicated service to the indigenous people and Latinos in a Guatemalan village over many years led him to lay down his life for them.

This campaign would not likely be conducted at St. Andrew's until the spring of 2018. Interestingly, its provisions allow for each parish to retain a certain percentage of funds for local projects. Let's pray that all goes well as the planning process unfolds.

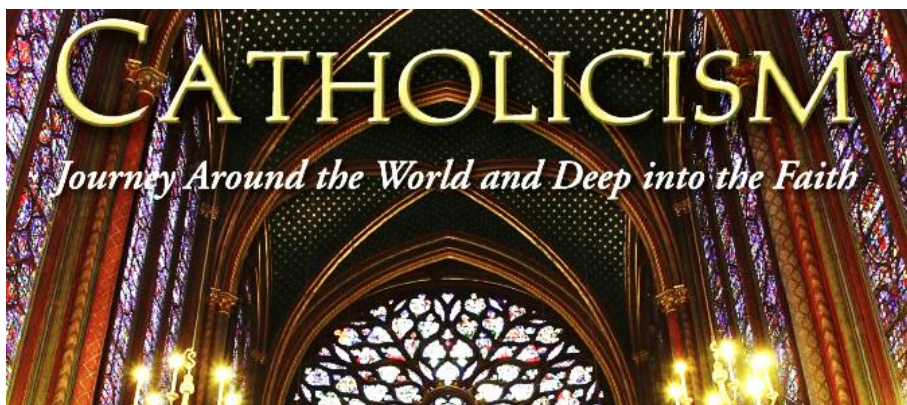

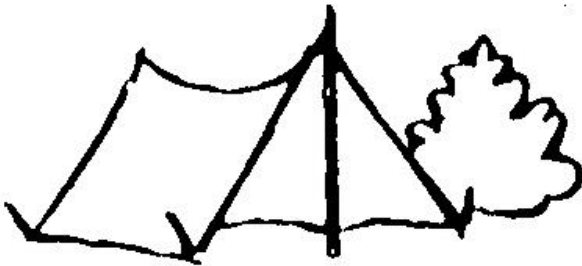
