PASTORAL REFLECTION

Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As we ease into the summer season, let's reflect on our personal commitments to serve the Lord in our church. This is the time for us—the Church of St. Thomas More—recommit ourselves to building the Kingdom of God right here and right now!! It is the time to do a “new thing” for the church and the world. It is the season of challenge and opportunity. It is also a time to revive and refresh ourselves as disciples. In this light, I need to ask your help and commitment.
