### The Holy Oils

Each year on Tuesday of Holy Week the Bishop gathers with the priests and faithful at the Cathedral for the Chrism Mass (open to all). At this special Mass the three Holy Oils--Oil of Catechumens, Oil of the Sick and Sacred Chrism are blessed and consecrated and then distributed to the priests to bring back to the parishes for use in the Sacraments for the coming year. This week the remaining Holy Oils will be burned in a special "oil lamp" near the tabernacle. The oil stocks will then be purified and cleansed and ready for the upcoming Chrism Mass.

### Reminder

**Holy Communion may not be brought to the hospital, nursing home or homebound on Holy Thursday, Good Friday or Holy Saturday** due to the Sacred Triduum and the Church’s liturgical law. The practice of bringing Holy Communion resumes with Easter Sunday.

## Holy Week Challenge

Ours is a tradition that treasures sacred rituals. You don't have to search for a more solemn time of the year to allow ritual, gesture and symbolism to have more meaning than our annual observance of the Sacred Triduum. It is a feast for the senses, and grace-filled opportunities to delve deeper into the core of the Paschal Mystery. Families are encouraged to take that extra "step" and attend the sacred liturgies of these days. After each share with the children to get their understanding of what is being commemorated and why these events/experiences are so vital to our faith lives.

### "Could you not stay awake with me for an hour?"

This Thursday following the Mass of the Lord's Supper the Church will remain open until midnight for the prayerful nightwatch. It is a silent and truly spiritual time during which all are invited to come and spend time with our Lord recalling the saving events we are commemorating during the Sacred Triduum. Families are especially encouraged to bring their children for a least a few moments to pray and be with the Lord. There are so many graces available during these intensely spiritual days.

**St. Joseph School Sets Registration  
March 18<sup>th</sup> – April 30<sup>th</sup>**

St. Joseph School will begin registration for new and returning students for the 2019-2020 school year beginning March 18<sup>th</sup> through April 30<sup>th</sup>.

For new enrollees, parents and students are required to participate in an interview with the principal and their teacher prior to registration. Parents are also required to present the student's complete immunization record and baptismal and/or official birth certificate. No child will be completely registered unless all of these documents are included with registration.

For current SJS students, forms will be sent home in the folders for the parents.

A registration fee of \$150 per student will be required. After the deadline of April 30<sup>th</sup>, the registration fee will be \$250. We encourage all parents of new and current students to register the students before April 30<sup>th</sup>.
