Accident	03.07	Something that happens that you cannot control and did not plan to do.	Yes
Baptism	03.09	A sacrament that makes one a member of the Christian community and a part of the Body of Christ.	Yes
Baptism	03.02	The sacrament of initiation that begins our life with Christ.	Yes
Bible	02.01	The special book that tells who God is and how we are to live as God's children.	Yes
Bread of Life	02.09	In the Eucharist, Jesus is really present and he feeds us with his Body and Blood.	Yes
Catholic Church	08.02	Started by Jesus, it is the Body of Christ and is made up of everyone who believes Jesus is the Son of God and savior of the world who come together to worship and spread the Good News.	Yes
Catholic Social Teaching	06.10	Jesus' lesson to love God and neighbor as handed down to us and taught by the Church.	No

Confirmation	03.06	The sacrament that completes the grace of Baptism by a special outpouring of the Holy Spirit.	Yes
Confirmation	03.02	The sacrament of initiation that gives us the strength to say that we believe that Jesus is the Son of God and that we will carry on his mission.	Yes
Consecrate	04.15	The prayer where the priest asks the Holy Spirit (using the words of Jesus) to come down and change the bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Christ.	Yes
Contrition	04.06	The part of the sacrament of penance where we feel sorry for our sins.	Yes
Creed	01.07	A prayer that lists the most important things Catholic Christians believe about our faith.	Yes
Creed (Holy Trinity in the)	01.08	The Creed teaches us important things about who the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit are.	No
Effects	03.03	Something that truly happens when God touches us, most especially in the sacraments.	No

Firm Amendment	04.06	The part of the sacrament of penance where we promise, with God's help, to not do that sin again.	Yes
Forever	01.09	Never ending, both on earth and in heaven.	Yes
Gloria	04.11	A song of praise to the Holy Trinity which we say or sing at the beginning of Mass.	No
Gospels	02.03	The special part of the New Testament, written by four of Jesus' friends, that tell us about his life and teachings.	Yes
Grace	03.01	The gift of God's life and love that we receive in the sacraments.	Yes
Grace	01.10	The special help God gives to us so that we can become like his Son, Jesus.	Yes

Kingdom of God	02.06	The people on earth and in heaven that belong to the Father and the Son.	No
Liturgy of the Word	04.09	The part of Mass where the Holy Word of God is read and the priest talks to us about the readings of the day.	No
Mass	04.01	The special time we gather as God's family to give thanks and worship God in prayer.	Yes
Mortal Sin	03.07	Something you choose to do knowing that it is against the will of God and will break your relationship with God.	Yes

Mother of God	01.11	Mary is the special woman that God the Father chose to be the mother of his Son, Jesus.	Yes

New Testament	02.02	The part of the Bible that tells us about Jesus' coming to save us and teaches us how to follow him on earth and to be with him in heaven.	Yes
Old Testament	02.02	The part of the Bible that tells us the stories of people of faith who lived before Jesus.	Yes
Parable	02.07	A story told by Jesus to help his followers to help us understand how God is always calling for us to come to him because he loves us.	Yes
Parables	02.06	Special stories told by Jesus to help his followers understand his Father in heaven, especially about how much his Father loves us.	No
Penance	04.06	The part of the sacrament of penance where the priest gives us something to do, or something to pray, as an offering to thank Jesus for forgiving us.	Yes
Penance/Reconciliation	03.08	A sacrament of forgiveness of sin and of healing.	Yes
Penitential Rite	04.10	A prayer during Mass when say we sorry for our sins and ask God's forgiveness saying the words: "Lord, have mercy."	No

Physical Sign	03.01	The signs you see and the words you hear in a sacrament, that make the grace they represent happen and that make us one with Jesus.	Yes
Prayer of the Faithful	04.13	The part of the Mass where we pray for all the people in our parish and the world to ask God to take care of them and answer their needs.	Yes
Real Presence	03.04	During the Mass, the Holy Spirit answers the prayers of the priest to change the ordinary bread and wine into the true Body and Blood of Jesus.	Yes
Resurrection	01.06	When God raised Jesus back to life three days after Jesus' death.	Yes
Sacrament	03.01	A special way in our faith life through which Jesus enters our life and gives us grace to become like him.	Yes
Seasons of Church Year	04.18	The celebrations of the Church year that remind and teach us about Jesus' life and death, his mother Mary and the saints.	Yes
Son of God	01.03	Jesus Christ, equal with the Father and the Holy Spirit.	Yes
Symbols	03.03	Objects which we can see that help us understand something about our faith that we cannot see.	No
Tabernacle	04.16	The very special place set aside to hold the bread and wine that have become the Body and Blood of Christ.	No
