Acolyte (Altar Server)	04.03	Someone who helps the priest at the altar during the celebration of the Mass.	No
Adoration	03.04	Praying silently and giving honor to God present in the tabernacle.	Yes
Advent	04.04	The four weeks before Christmas which help us prepare our hearts to celebrate Jesus' birth.	Yes
Anointing of the Sick	03.05	The sacrament given to people who are very old or sick. The holy oil and prayers give the person strength, peace and courage to face their illness.	Yes
Apostles' Creed	01.01	A prayer that tells what Catholics believe about God the Father, Jesus the Son and the Holy Spirit.	Yes
Baptismal Call	11.03	Because we have been baptized, we are called to be holy and to teach others about God and how much he loves us.	Yes
Bishops	08.08	Successors to the Apostles – which means they follow in an unbroken chain back to Peter, the first pope.	Yes
Bishops	08.02	Men who have received the highest level of Holy Orders; they are the most important teachers in the Church.	Yes

Christians	08.01	Everyone who has been anointed with the Holy Spirit in Baptism and follows Jesus.	No

Clergy	08.02	Another name for priests, these men have received the second level of Holy Orders; they guide the Church and bring the sacraments to the people.	Yes
Communion of Saints	08.06	All people alive now and those who have died, who have loved and served God as his friends in this life.	No
Deacon	04.03	A man who has received the sacrament of Holy Orders who helps the priest and bishop in the work of the Church.	No

Liturgy	04.01	A celebration where we give praise and thanks to God for all he has done for us.	Yes
Liturgy of the Word	04.05	The part of Mass where the Holy Word of God is read and the priest talks to us about the readings of the day.	Yes
Matrimony	03.06	Another name for marriage, it is the sacrament where a man and a woman agree to be partners for life in a family, to help make each other and their children grow in holiness.	Yes
Ministers of Holy Communion	04.03	A person who helps the priest give out Communion during Mass.	No
Morality	05.01	Helps us know whether our actions are right or wrong.	Yes
Noah	02.07	The people before the flood disobeyed God but Noah was obedient -- he did as God asked. Noah and his family survived because they had faith in God and God's promise.	No
