Active Parishioner Status

We receive requests from people who live in Jessamine County who wish to serve as witnesses for weddings or to be godparents or sponsors for the Sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation. Part of that request is to be able to verify that a person is an "active member" here. An active member of a parish is defined as one who:

- Is properly registered and on the parish rolls.
- Faithfully attends Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation
- Participates in parish activities when possible
- Uses the parish envelope system.

While assessments of an inquirer's status will be made individually, the above are the main factors that will be considered in making that determination.

Sacrament of Reconciliation—Confessions are heard on Saturday from 3:45 to 4:15 p.m. and on Sunday 20 minutes before each Mass. Confessions may also be heard upon request. Communal Penance Services are announced in the bulletin.

Sacrament of Baptism—Parents must be registered, active members of St. Luke for two months before their child can be Baptized. They must also attend instructions prior to Baptism. Call the parish office to make arrangements.

Sacrament of Marriage—Six months' notice and completion of the diocesan marriage preparation program is required. Call the parish office for arrangements.

Instructions in the Faith—A program of formation and information (R.C.I.A.) is offered each year beginning in September. Call or email the Rectory for more information.

Join the Diocese of Lexington in the 2019 National Weekend of Prayer for Faith, Hope, and Life--

Nearly 50,000 Americans and over 700 Kentuckians die by suicide every year. Frequently, they die feeling alone and like a burden to those who love them the most. For each person who dies by suicide about 135 individuals are exposed to this death and many are significantly impacted by this death to the point where they may think about taking their own life. There is, perhaps, no place more equipped to provide a sense of belonging and to inspire hope to a struggling soul than a place of worship, specifically, our church and the Diocese of Lexington. As Catholics, we hold that life is sacred. Science tells us that suicide is an error in judgment where the suicidal individual feels alienated from their cherished communities and feels like a burden to those who they love the very most. Suicidal people do not want to die, rather they do not want to continue living in the pain that they are in. Sometimes a mental illness, addiction, or a traumatic past contributes to this faulty thinking. Sometimes it does not.

The Diocese of Lexington must be a place of hope for all and, to that end, we pray for those who are struggling with suicide or whose lives have been touched by suicide on this National Weekend of Prayer for Faith, Hope, and Life, September 6 – 8, 2019. The National Weekend of Prayer also stands in honor of World Suicide Prevention Day on September 10. Yet a baby is aborted every 23 seconds in the U.S. Over 4,000 babies are aborted every day. About 60 million babies have been aborted since the decision of Roe v Wade in January 1973. Abortion is truly "America's holocaust". • As a result of Roe v Wade and sister case, Doe v Bolton, America has some of the most liberal laws on abortion in the world, effectively allowing abortion on demand throughout the whole nine months of pregnancy. • The abortion rate in the U.S. is higher than Western Europe and Canada. It is not as high as the rates in China, Cuba and the former Soviet Union countries which have reached epidemic levels. • Teenagers constitute around 20% of all abortions in the U.S. About 55% of minors who have abortions do not tell their parents. • 17 states use public funds to pay for abortions, so about 15% of all abortions in the U.S. are paid for with public money. Our tax dollars fund Planned Parenthood, the nation's largest abortion provider and promoter of casual sex and abortion.
