Sick Calls – Please call the rectory to arrange for Father Jasany to bring the Sacraments when a member of your family is hospitalized.

Weddings – Parishioners are asked to call the rectory office at least 6 months in advance of the wedding to schedule an appointment with Father Jasany.

Baptisms – The 1st & 3rd Sunday of the month at 12:00 pm. Parents are required to attend Pre-Baptism Class. Arrangements must be made a minimum of 2 weeks prior to the date of baptism. Before parents baptize their child, Diocesan and parish policy requires you to complete a Baptism Preparation Class. **The next class will be on Thursday, August 6th at St. John Nepomucene Parish.** Reservations needed; please call 216-61-8444 make your reservation.

Godparent and Sponsor Certificate – Sponsors for Baptism or Confirmation must be registered and practicing members of the Church, attending weekly and Holy Day Masses for a minimum of 3 months prior to the celebration of the Sacraments for which they have requested the certificate. Please note individuals 18 years of age and older, no longer in school, need to register.

Karen's Corner

Did you know that one of the best books I have read about the Bible is Jeffrey Cavins' book, "Walking with God: A Journey through the Bible"? Cavins' explanations of each book and character in the bible is incredible!

He is a Catholic writer with a degree in Theology. I have mentioned him before as the author who divided the Bible into 12 time periods and has a schedule for reading the story of salvation over 90 days using 14 books of the Bible. I have done the 90 days, and in reading these 14 books, our story of salvation has been eye opening! I know I have been harping about reading Scripture, and the reason is that before Vatican II, Catholics were told not to read or interpret the Bible. After Vatican II, Scripture study was opened up for us, but how to read the Scriptures was not something we were taught. There are incredible stories in the Old Testament about people who were sinners and their repentance as well as some of the most beautiful poetry and prose the world has ever seen!

God invites each of us to become immersed in the story of His Word, which includes great deeds, adventure, love, betrayal, sacrifice, miracles and much more. Most importantly, though, the Scriptures give us a story in which we can meet God himself, come to know his infinite love for each of us and respond to his invitation to enter into this epic tale. That is one of the things about reading Scripture to keep in mind; what is the genre of the book you are reading? Is it a history? Is it a prophetic book? Remember that prophecy in the Old Testament was not a telling of the future, but rather warnings about what would happen to the people of Israel if they didn't turn their

hearts back to God.

Is it a love story? Read the Song of Solomon! Want some science fiction? Read about the Dragon in Daniel 14! How about the Witch of Endor? She was a medium who apparently summoned the Prophet Samuel's spirit, at the demand of King Saul of the Kingdom of Israel in the I Samuel 28:3-25. Want a great poem? Psalm 23. Want a good story with a moral? Luke 10:29-35. Prayers? Luke 11:2-4. Satire? The Book of Jonah! History? Read Acts of the Apostles!

I used to tell my students that if they could come up with a genre, I could find a Bible passage for them! I could go on, but these are just a few things that are found in the Bible. Sacred Scripture is full of colorful, beautiful and inspiring stories about real people. Sinners and saints alike are included! Just keep in mind that many of the "rules and regulations" are part of the history of the church and as such we don't follow them literally, otherwise I might have to sacrifice a bull in my backyard! Keep your eyes and ears open and I will see you soon!
