

CHURCH SECURITY INFORMATION

Following the church shootings last year near San Antonio the parish's Security Committee has begun to take steps to ensure the safety of all St. Thomas the Apostle parishioners. The first step will be to restrict access to the church during liturgical services. Effective April 7th and 8th, 2018, once Mass has begun, all doors into the church will be locked from the inside with the exception of the double doors facing 16th Street. Anyone arriving late for Mass will only be able to enter the church through the 16th Street doors. Parishioners will be able to exit the church through any of the locked doors as well as the doors facing 16th Street. A panic bar will be installed on the wooden, double doors facing west similar to the panic bar on the glass door by the sacristy. These doors will allow exiting at any time simply by pushing the bar. Regarding the door by the baptismal font in the sanctuary, this door has a door knob lock that, when locked, allows exiting from the inside but does not allow entry from the outside.

Signs will be posted around the church building to remind parishioners of the locked doors.

The staff at St. Thomas the Apostle Church takes the safety and security of all the parishioners very seriously. We are confident that the steps taken at this time will minimize any problematic incidents.

INFORMACION DE SEGURIDAD DE LA IGLESIA

Después de los tiroteos de la iglesia el año pasado cerca de San Antonio, el Comité de Seguridad de la parroquia ha comenzado a tomar medidas para garantizar la seguridad de todos los feligreses de la Iglesia de Santo Tomás Apóstol. El primer paso será restringir el acceso a la Iglesia durante los servicios litúrgicos. A partir del 7 y 8 de abril del 2018, una vez que haya comenzado la misa, todas las puertas de la iglesia estarán cerradas desde adentro con la excepción de las puertas dobles que dan a la calle 16. Cualquier persona que llegue tarde a misa solo podrá entrar a la iglesia a través de las puertas de la calle 16. Los feligreses podrán salir de la iglesia a través de cualquiera de las puertas cerradas, así como las puertas que dan a la calle 16. Se instalará una barra antipánico en las puertas dobles de madera orientadas hacia el oeste, similar a la barra antipánico en la puerta de vidrio junto a la sacristía. Estas puertas permitirán salir en cualquier momento simplemente presionando la barra. En cuanto a la puerta por la fuente bautismal en el santuario, esta puerta tiene un bloqueo del botón de la puerta que, cuando está bloqueado, permite salir desde el interior, pero no permite la entrada desde el exterior.

Se colocarán letreros alrededor del edificio de la iglesia para recordar a los feligreses las puertas cerradas.

El personal de la Iglesia Santo Tomás Apóstol toma muy en serio la seguridad de todos los feligreses. Estamos seguros de que los pasos tomados en este momento minimizarán cualquier incidente problemático.

Choose one of these activities and do them each day for a week:


Pray scripture each day. (Use the daily readings—bulletin)	Go to daily Mass	Go to Adoration and Confession on Tues- day

The Fire of Your Love by Will Olive

Last week I addressed the first precept of The Church. Precepts are the laws of The Church that every Catholic must follow to remain in good standing with The Church. The first precept was to attend Mass every Sunday and on Holy Days of obligation, and to refrain from working on those days.

The second precept of The Church is "to confess one's sins, receiving the sacrament of Reconciliation at least once each year."

We must go to confession at least once a year, but remember, that is the minimum. We really should go far more often. If a Catholic only goes once a year, they are highly encouraged to make that confession during the season of Lent. So, now is the right time to go to Confession if you have not been in a year.

The Sacrament of Reconciliation is not just about confessing your sins to the priest and having them forgiven. The real reason for the sacrament is that through that forgiveness we can be healed. I know it can be a hard sacrament to embrace. I have a hard time embracing it. But, like many things in life, once we show up and attend, we actually find it to be more enjoyable than we ever thought it would be. Yes, reconciliation can be enjoyable, after all, at least for a short period of time, we are back to enjoying God's grace.

The authority for the sacrament is derived from Jesus when he heals the paralytic (Mark 2:1-12; Matthew 9:1-8). Some of the scribes were watching and Jesus knew what they were thinking, so he asked them, "Why do you think evil in your hearts? For which is easier, to say, 'Your sins are forgiven,' or to say, 'Rise and walk?'" Then just to show him he can do both, he told the paralytic to rise and walk, and he rose and walked!

The sacrament was then handed down to the disciples after Jesus was resurrected. When he appeared before them, he breathed on them and said, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained" (John 20:22-23).
