IMPORTANT NOTICE- Illness and the Liturgy

In the most recent publication from the California Department of Public Health (CDPH), a sample of health providers reported 4.6% of the patient visits were for "influenza-like illness". This percentage is above the epidemic threshold of 3.7%. The CDPH believes this number will continue to rise. Bishop Jaime Soto recommends we take the following **temporary measures** until March 1st.

- ***Discontinue the distribution of Holy Communion in the cup.**
- ***Encourage reception of Holy Communion in the hand.**
- ***The Sign of Peace should be offered without shaking hands** (for example: a smile or a nod of the head while saying "Peace be with you.")
- ***Do not hold hands during the "Our Father."**
- ***Those who distribute Holy Communion are to cleanse their hands with antiseptic solution containing alcohol before and after administering the Sacrament.**
- ***Ministers of the Eucharist who visit the sick and the homebound should observe these same precautions.**

The obligation to attend Sunday Mass does not apply to those who are ill, especially those who suffer from contagious disease. Out of consideration for others, those with flu-like symptoms are asked to remain home.
