### Letter to President Obama from Catholic Bishops

A letter, dated February 23, 2015, was sent by the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops to President Obama, regarding the situation with the Islamic State of Libya (SIS or ISIL). As mentioned in the letter, Pope Francis said that the twenty-one Coptic Christians were beheaded "for the mere fact of being Christians." There is more information in the letter regarding our right to use force to stop ISIL, but always in the context of "international and humanitarian law." ## PROHETIC ANOINTING

The solemnity of today's readings invites us into silent contemplation of the mystery of our redemption. There are so many levels on which to understand the events of the Passion. The woman who anoints Jesus acts prophetically in a way that the other disciples do not yet grasp. Anointing is for priests, prophets, and kings, and also for the preparation of the dead. It is for healing and for holiness. Her action acknowledges the imminent events of the passion and death of the Lord, and points toward his resurrection and triumph over evil and death. He is priest and victim, prophet and God, King and Lord. All these things are acknowledged in her prophetic anointing.

## TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITIONS

Is today "Palm Sunday" or "Passion Sunday"? Though now known officially as Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord, confusion is understandable, since before the 1969 reform of the calendar two separate Sundays bore these titles. Passion Sunday was a week before Palm Sunday. To add to the confusion, the Gospel accounts of the Passion of the Lord were not read on Passion Sunday, but on Palm Sunday! On Passion Sunday, the cross and statues were veiled in full purple drapes. The organ had fallen silent at the beginning of Lent, and now the sanctuary bells were replaced by wooden clappers. The introit (opening chant) for the old Mass of Passion Sunday hints at a reason for reform: "Do me justice, O God, and fight my fight against a faithless people" (Psalm 42). This liturgy was laden with references to the "infidelity" of the Jews, a theme that gave rise to inflammatory preaching and, in some places, attacks against the persons and property of the Jewish people. This does not stand as a "treasure" of any sort in our tradition. Our authentic tradition, rather, is the ability to reflect and repent and to seek reconciliation with the Jews, our brothers and sisters in the love and service of God.

Lorraine Latreille will coordinate the Day of Recollection for Ministers on March 21st. The P.C. will co-sponsor this event with the Liturgy Ministry.

The meeting concluded with a prayer by Fr. Joyle.

### ANNUAL CATHOLIC APPEAL

On March 7th & 8th our parish conducted the Diocesan Annual Catholic Appeal collection. 2015 is the 25th year of the Annual Catholic Appeal. Bishop Soto made "Assisting people in need" as the appeal for this year.

During those weekend Masses 406 parishioners contributed through pledges or gifts to the campaign. The total contribution amounted to \$14,288.42. We recognize that several parishioners had already contributed to the campaign by returning envelopes sent to them directly from the Diocese. 25% of the funds raised will be returned to the parish, which will help our parishioners in need.

**HEALTH MINISTRY**

**It's not too late to get your flu shot.**

Its not too late to vaccinate—as long as flu viruses are spreading its not to late to protect yourself and your loved ones. The flu brings a fever, cough, sore throat, runny or stuffy nose, muscle aches, fatigue and days in bed. More than 200,000 people are hospitalized each year with complications from the flu. Estimated 3,000 to 49,000 people die from the flu annually. The vaccine is recommended for everyone over 6 months old. The high risk group for serious complications from the flu, like pneumonia, include young children, pregnant women and people over 65 years of age, and those with a medical condition. Check with your doctor for the dosage needed for young children.

**Free Blood Pressure Clinic—April 12**

The April Blood Pressure Clinic will be held on the second Sunday of April, on April 12th, instead of the first Sunday, which this year is Easter Sunday.

High blood pressure is known as the “silent killer” because is usually has no symptoms, and if left untreated can be fatal. Let the nurses of St. Paul parish help you monitor your blood pressure by attending the free clinics held usually on the first Sundays of the month from 8:30am to 12:30pm. Watch the website, church bulletin boards, and the parish bulletin for any date changes for the clinic.

This is a free service, provided by St. Paul Health Ministry. We also provide information and activities for your healthy mind, body and spirit.

## Domingo de Ramos “de la Pasión del Señor 29 de marzo de 2015

### UNCIÓN PROFÉTICA

La solemnidad de las lecturas de hoy nos invita a una contemplación silenciosa del misterio de nuestra redención. Hay tantas maneras de comprender los sucesos de la Pasión. La mujer que unge a Jesús se comporta proféticamente y de un modo que los otros discípulos aún no comprenden. La unción es para los sacerdotes, los profetas y los reyes, y también para la preparación de los muertos. Es para la sanación y la santidad. Su acción reconoce los sucesos de la pasión y la muerte del Señor que se avecinan, y señala hacia la resurrección y el triunfo sobre el mal y la muerte. La lectura de la Pasión está dividida entre el narrador, Jesús, los personajes de la Pasión y el pueblo. De nuevo, si la misa se celebra propiamente, desde sus bancas, los fieles proclaman las palabras del pueblo, gritando: “¡Crucifiquenlo!”

Los dos evangelios de este domingo nos recuerdan lo fácil que es abandonar al Señor. Los mismos cristianos que afuera del Templo le cantaban hosanna piden su muerte dentro del Templo. Los mismos que en la calle le celebraban con ramos, lo coronan con espinas en el santuario.
