### LOVE ONE ANOTHER

Last Sunday we heard the familiar passage from John's Gospel in which Jesus uses the metaphor of the vine and the branches. In that passage we were told that if we remained in Christ we would bear much fruit. Today's Gospel tells us just what that fruit is: love. Today's second reading and Gospel together create a great hymn to love. The chorus of this hymn is simple—God loves us so much that Jesus was sent into the world so that we would have life. The Lord Jesus, who last week told us to remain in him, this week tells us to remain in his love. In a world marked by division and terrorism, the Lord's final words in today's Gospel are a great challenge: "This I command you: love one another."

### TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITIONS

With June not far off, attention in the parish turns to the celebration of weddings. Perhaps no other area of parish life is more shaped or challenged by the expectations of our culture. An old Irish proverb, "Marry in Lent and you're soon to repent," is amplified by another warning: "Marry in May and rue the day!" Memories of old pagan parties in May endured, and the Irish felt wedding receptions in May would be a stress on community morals. Queen Victoria did not approve of May weddings either, and her influence is still felt on family calendars, as is her daughter's introduction of the white wedding gown. Sometimes we mistake customs and curiosities for tradition. Tradition with a capital "T" has to do with Christ's miraculous rescue of the wedding feast at Cana, his affirmation of a man and woman pledging lifelong fidelity at the heart of a community's feast. The Church cherished that memory over time, but it took a millennium for us to think of marriage as a sacrament. Much of the rest of what we associate with weddings has to do with culture, customs, and family practices. A wise rabbi once said that "tradition is not wearing your father's hat; tradition is having a child." Don't let Queen Victoria reign over your wedding plans!

## SOCIAL JUSTICE

### “No on SB 128

If Senate Bill 128 passes, physician-assisted suicide will become legal in California. As noted by Californians Against Assisted Suicides, “Some legislators are eager to pass assisted suicide laws at a time when lack of access and healthcare disparity in poorer areas are serious concerns. SB 128 will affect all Californians....”

The Catholic Church, along with many organizations, such as the CA Medical Association, CA for Disability Rights, Hispanic for Life, and Patients Rights Council, oppose assisted suicide. Because life is sacred, Catholic teaching holds that assisted suicide can never be permitted. Euthanasia and assisted suicide stand in contradiction to the Catholic understanding that all life bears God’s image and his inherent dignity.

Note: There will be a petition signing opposing SB 128 after all the Masses next weekend. Also a flyer will be in next week’s bulletin; “What the Catholic Church Teaches about the End of Life.”

**RELIGIOUS EDUCATION CENTER**

The St. Paul Bereavement Ministry provides support for parishioners who have the Celebration of Life for members of their families or loved ones who have services conducted at our church. They attend vigils, lead rosaries, and assist at the Celebration of Life Masses.

If the deceased is a member of the parish the Parish Members of the Ministry also provide, free of charge, a reception in the Parish Hall. Members of the Ministry set up the hall, provide desserts and salads for the reception, serve the food, and clean up after the reception. Members of the reception teams place table covers and flowers on the tables, serve food and generally assist the family to make the reception a stress free time for family and friends to socialize and remember the deceased loved one.

The members of the Ministry are normally asked to donate once or twice a month.

**The Ministry is always in need of new members**, who would like to lessen the impact of the death of a loved one by providing a simple dish for the reception.

The Ministry also provides a twice a year 8 week support group to help those who are coping with the loss. These support groups are held once a week in the Religious Education Center. ## Sexto Domingo de Pascua 10 de mayo 2015

### AMENSE UNOS A OTROS

El domingo pasado escuchamos el familiar pasaje del Evangelio de san Juan en el que Jesús usa el símbolo de la viña y las ramas. En ese pasaje escuchamos que si permanecemos en Cristo daremos mucho fruto. El Evangelio de hoy nos dice cuál es ese fruto: el amor. La segunda lectura de hoy junto con el Evangelio crean un gran himno de amor. El coro de este himno es sencillo – Dios nos ama tanto que envió a Jesús al mundo para que tuviéramos vida. El Señor Jesús que nos dijo la semana pasada que permaneciéramos en él, esta semana nos dice que permanezcamos en su amor. En un mundo marcado por las divisiones y el terrorismo, las últimas palabras del Evangelio de hoy son un gran reto: “Esto es lo que les mando: que se amen los unos a los otros”.

### TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

Gracias a los grupos, asociaciones y movimientos tenemos muchos movimientos evangélicos dentro de la Iglesia católica. Movimientos como Cursillos de Cristiandad, Talleres de Oración, S.I.N.E., la Renovación Carismática, Espiritualidad de la Cruz, Jornadas de Vida Cristiana, que dependen de himnos religiosos o de un canto lema para ir formando una conciencia cristiana en sus miembros o seguidores. Esta formación se basa en una relación íntima y emocional entre Jesús y sus seguidores.

Un himno carismático dice así: “Yo tengo un amigo que me ama”, y otro de ellos dice: “Él es mi amigo Jesús, él es Dios, él es rey, es amor y verdad”. Estos dos himnos de autor desconocido, enfatizan lo bello que es tener una relación íntima con el Señor, mejor dicho, con nuestro amigo Jesús. Jesús mismo enfatiza este tipo de relación cuando dice: “No los llamo ya siervos... a ustedes los he llamado amigos” (Juan 15:15).

Toda amistad se basa en una mutua atracción, simpatía y reciprocidad. Jesús dice que somos sus amigos 1) cuando hacemos lo que nos manda y 2) porque nos enseña lo que recibe de su Padre. La amistad con Jesús, es más que una emoción, se basa en el compromiso y la perseverancia.

### EL ANGEL DE LA ORACION

Un ángel de Dios se le aparece a la que será madre de Sansón, que era estéril. Le dice que va a concebir un hijo, el cual debe ser nazareo, consagrado a Dios desde el nacimiento. Él no deberá beber vino ni bebida fermentada. No debe comer nada impuro ni dejarse cortar el cabello. En una segunda oportunidad, se le aparece también al padre, llamado Manóaj, quien le pregunta su nombre. El ángel le contesta: ¿por qué me preguntas mi nombre, si es maravilloso? [...] Si quieres preparar un holocausto, ofréceselo a Dios [...]. Y Manóaj tomó el cabrito y la oblación y lo ofreció a Dios sobre la roca. Manóaj y su mujer estaban mirando. Cuando la llama subía del altar hacia el cielo, el ángel subía en la llama.

El ángel comunica a los padres de Sansón la noticia que tendrían un hijo y que, según los planes de Dios debe ser consagrado a Dios desde el nacimiento. Y cuando ofrecen un sacrificio, el ángel sube con la llama hacia Dios, para significar que los ángeles ofrecen nuestros sacrificios y oraciones a Dios.

El arcángel san Rafael es uno de los que presentan nuestras oraciones a Dios. Dice: “Yo soy Rafael, uno de los siete ángeles que presentamos las oraciones de los justos y tienen entrada a la Gloria de Señor. Cuando orabas tú y tu nuera Sara, yo presentaba ante Dios tus oraciones”.

SB 128 afectará a todos los californianos. ... "
