### FEEDING THE WORLD

With today's two accounts of feeding miracles and the psalm response about the Lord's hand feeding us, it is easy to gloss over the marvelous hymn in Ephesians. It is built around the most potent biblical numbers: one, three, and seven. The core of it is the word "one" expressed seven times. Three of these describe the church: one body, one Spirit, one hope; the next three are the foundations of the church: one Lord [Jesus], one faith, one baptism. All of these are bound up together in the one Father of all. While we might feel daunted by the prospect of duplicating the wonders worked by Elisha and Jesus in the feeding of multitudes, Ephesians gives us a more realistic way to live and "feed" others as the church: by living in humility and gentleness, by acting with patience, bearing with each other in love, and always seeking and striving to preserve unity through peace. Who among us cannot increase the way we "feed" the church and the world by living this way? We are always called upon to "feed" the world in the literal sense; but our mission as church tells us that others are also fed by the way we live and act each moment of each day.

### TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITIONS

Sooner or later, as they plan their wedding liturgy, a couple will receive some advice about a "unity candle." They need one, they are told (at great expense); it is a tradition; it is what Catholics have always done. Not so. In the last thirty years or so, the custom has enjoyed wide popularity in the United States. It has never been officially part of our liturgy, and it exists in tension with some of our core symbols. Usually there are two smaller candles and one larger one to be lit from the smaller. Large candles in our tradition always mean Christ, and smaller ones are always tokens of our baptismal candle. If the candles are meant for a kind of renewal of baptismal vows, then the meaning is clearer, yet this is seldom the understanding. Why, then, are those smaller candles extinguished?

It's hard to tell where these pesky candles came from. Some suggest that the Presbyterian Church, which has a very lean wedding liturgy, introduced them as an option for extending a short service. Generally, it's been experienced as a "photo opportunity" rather than a genuine liturgical ritual. The "unity candle," a recent invention rather than an authentic tradition, has not been approved as an adaptation to our rite, and it is to be hoped that it will gradually disappear from view.

### PASTORAL COUNCIL

The Pastoral Council met June 15, 2015. Minutes were read, corrections made and approved.

Two signs, English and Spanish have been placed on the door of the "Cry-Room" asking parishioners to observe the rules when using the room.

The Bible Sharing Program, led by Lorraine will conclude June 28th. It will resume in the Fall.

There are now five crosses and a spare for the Vocation Prayer Program. Forms are available for sign ups.

Fr. Joyle reported that First Communion and Confirmation went well. Mention was made there were not enough Extraordinary Ministers for First Communion.

Ann Viernes and Esther Conrad are chairing the White Elephant again this year. Fr. Joyle told the council the need for more fundraisers to defray expenses. The Mrs. St. Paul program is being considered again to help expenses for the Youth Program and general expenses.

Dale gave a presentation on last year's Luau. Goal for this year is \$6,000. net. Goal is to sell 304 tickets. Tables reserved only if a full table is purchased. No tickets to be sold at the door.

Gustavo has enough volunteers to help sign up parishioners for the Catholic Legislative Network for the weekend of June 27/28.

The Parish Festival is coming up and the Heimericks and Cervantes families have agreed to chair it this year again.

The Divine Mercy Devotion program will be held every Friday at 3:00pm, beginning June 19.

SPYM is sponsoring a \$5 movie night. This includes popcorn, hot dog and a drink, on July 18, 2015. All are invited to watch "The Big Hero."

## Decimoseptimo Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario 26 de julio 2015

### ALIMENTANDO AL MUNDO

Al oír las narraciones de cómo Eliseo y Jesús multiplican los alimentos, y el salmo responsorial sobre como la mano del Señor nos alimenta, es fácil caer en la tentación de pasar por alto el maravilloso himno de la carta a los efesios en la Segunda lectura. El himno se centra en los números más potentes de la tradición bíblica: el uno, el tres y el siete. La médula del himno es el número uno, repetido siete veces. Tres de ellas se refieren a la Iglesia: un solo cuerpo, un solo Espíritu, como también una sola es la esperanza. Los próximas tres son los fundamentos de la Iglesia: un solo Señor, una sola fe, un solo bautismo. Y todos estos se juntan en un solo Dios y Padre de todos. La idea de repetir los milagros obrados por Eliseo y por Jesús al alimentar las multitudes nos desalienta, claro está, pero la carta a los efesios nos ofrece un modo más realizable de vivir como Iglesia y de alimentar a los demás en la Iglesia: ser siempre humildes y amables; ser comprensivos y soportarnos mutuamente con amor, y esforzarnos en mantenernos unidos en el Espíritu con el vínculo de la paz. ¿Quién de nosotros no puede “alimentar” a la comunidad de la Iglesia viviendo de esta manera? Es verdad que siempre estamos llamados a “alimentar” al mundo en el sentido literal de la palabra, pero nuestra misión como Iglesia también nos dice que a los demás también hay que alimentarlos por la manera en que vivimos y actuamos cada momento de cada día.

### TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

Para los hispanos y las personas de otras culturas, el recuerdo y vinculación con nuestros antepasados es algo muy importante. De hecho, en las culturas latinoamericanas se usan los apellidos del padre y de la madre para enfatizar de dónde y de quiénes provienen. Muchas personas han conservado esta misma tradición aquí en Estados Unidos. Este sentido de conectarnos a nuestros antepasados también se encuentra en la fe cristiana. Mediante la imposición de manos, por citar un ejemplo, llegamos hasta los apóstoles.

Podríamos decir que los cuatro evangelios subrayan esta vinculación con los orígenes de nuestra fe. La forma en que lo hacen, aunque pequeña, es interesante. Luego de que todos comieron de los panes y los peces multiplicados por Jesús, recogieron doce canastos llenos de pan. En cierta manera, los evangelistas aseguran que el pan que Jesús dio al gentío de su tiempo nos lo sigue dando hoy en la eucaristía. Ahora, este pan es la carne de Jesús, quien se hace ofrenda y hostia (sacrificio) por nosotros.

### MEDITACION

*Los justos resplandecerán como el sol  
en el reino de su Padre*

Cristo le devolverá el reino a su Padre, dice san Pablo, no en sentido de que renunciaría a su poder devolviéndole su reino, sino porque somos nosotros quienes seremos el reino de Dios, cuando hayamos sido hechos conforme a la gloria de su cuerpo, constituidos reino de Dios por la glorificación de su cuerpo. Es a nosotros a quienes devolverá al Padre, como reino, según lo que está dicho en el evangelio: Venid benditos de mi Padre, tomad posesión del reino preparado para vosotros desde la creación del mundo.

*Los justos brillarán como el sol en el reino de su Padre.* Porque el Hijo le entregará a Dios como reino a aquellos a los que convidó a su reino, a aquellos a los quienes prometió la bienaventuranza de este misterio con estas palabras: *Bienaventurados los limpios de corazón, porque ellos verán a Dios*; aquellos a los que devuelve a su Padre como su reino ven a Dios.

El Señor mismo explicó a sus apóstoles en que consiste este reino. *El reino de Dios está dentro de vosotros.* Y si alguno quiere saber quien es el que devuelve el reino, que escuche: *Cristo resucito de entre los muertos para ser entre los muertos el primer resucitado. Ya que la muerte vino por un hombre, también por un hombre viene la resurrección.* Todo esto concierne al misterio del Cuerpo, porque Cristo es el primer resucitado de entre los muertos. Es, pues, para el progreso de la humanidad asumida por Cristo como *Dios lo será todo en todos.*
