GOD'S WAYS

TODAY'S READINGS

First Reading — When the wicked turn away from their wickedness they have committed and do what is right, they shall surely live (Ezekiel 18:25-28).

Psalm — Remember your mercies, O Lord (Psalm 25).

Second Reading — Consider others as better than yourselves; look not to your own interests, but to the interests of others (Philippians 2:1-11 [1-5]).

Gospel — Tax collectors and prostitutes are entering the kingdom of God ahead of you (Matthew 21:28-32).

In the stream of readings during this portion of Ordinary Time one week's texts can often appear to pick up exactly where the previous week's concluded. The sentiments expressed in today's first reading seem to be a direct reaction to the Gospel passage we heard last week. In that Gospel, the landowner pays the same wages to his workers whether they worked for a full day or for only a few minutes. Today Ezekiel gives us the lament, "The LORD's way is not fair!" (Ezekiel 18:25).

These Sundays in Ordinary Time offer us a glimpse into the ways of the Lord. We see how God's way has the tendency to turn the accepted conventions of the day upside down. Those who always expected that their way to heaven was guaranteed are disappointed. Those who thought they never had a chance are given that chance. Today offers us another opportunity to discover the abundance of God's mercy and love.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITIONS

Eucharistic Prayer IV is, like Eucharistic Prayer III, a fresh composition from the 1960s, based on a prayer from the tradition of the ancient church of Alexandria. It has an interesting structural feature. The new prayers all nod toward the East with the *epiclesis*, or calling down of the Spirit, over the gifts. In this prayer the Spirit is asked to come down again, after the consecration, to make holy the communicants who "partake of this one Bread and one Chalice that, gathered into one body by the Holy Spirit, they may truly become a living sacrifice in Christ to the praise of your glory." This beautiful phrase is well worth meditating on. What is the goal of your reception of Holy Communion today?

The preface for this Eucharistic Prayer is firmly attached to the prayer, and the directives for using the prayer anchor it to Ordinary Time. It is not intended to be an option if the Mass has a proper preface of its own, like a funeral, a Lenten weekday, or a great feast. It is not often used these days, in part because of these limitations. At first, it was suggested that this prayer was better suited to small groups of people who were well educated in scripture. This was kind of an odd stipulation, especially since its images are so beautiful and worthy of attention.

TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

La práctica de usar nudos en una cuerda para contar oraciones tiene una larga trayectoria en la fe cristiana. Originalmente un cordón con 150 nudos o piedritas se usaba para contar la recitación de los 150 salmos encontrados en la Sagrada Escritura. Con el tiempo, visto que mucha gente no podía leer o recitar de memoria los salmos, se sustituyeron por el uso de 150 Padrenuestros. A finales de la Edad Media muchos sustituyeron los Padrenuestros con el saludo del ángel Gabriel a María. En el siglo XVI se formuló lo que hoy reconocemos como el Avemaría, y en el año 1569, el Papa Pío V estableció el Rosario en su forma y uso actual.

En 1592 un fraile dominico mandó hacer una imagen de la Virgen del Rosario para su convento en Guatemala. Según la leyenda, María viajaba por América con su Hijo y éste se quedó dormido en Guatemala, por lo cual se quedaron allí. En 1821 los independistas guatemaltecos tomaron a la Virgen del Rosario como protectora y en 1833 fue nombrada patrona oficial de Guatemala.

MEDITEMOS

Siguiendo el catecismo de la Iglesia podemos decir que los ángeles son seres espirituales creados por Dios. Son seres inmortales, dotados de inteligencia y voluntad. La misión de los ángeles es amar, servir y dar gloria a Dios, ser mensajeros, cuidar y ayudar a los hombres. Ellos están constantemente en la presencia de Dios, atentos a sus órdenes, orando, adorando, vigilando, cantando, alabando a Dios y pregonando sus perfecciones. Se puede decir que son mediadores, custodios, guardianes, protectores y ministros de la justicia divina.

Arcángel San Miguel: es el que arrojó del Cielo a Lucifer y a los ángeles que le seguían y quien mantiene la batalla contra Satanás y demás demonios para destruir su poder y ayudar a la Iglesia militante a obtener la victoria final. El nombre de Miguel significa "quien como Dios". Su conducta y fidelidad nos debe invitar a reconocer siempre el señorío a Jesús y buscar en todo momento la gloria de Dios.

Arcángel San Gabriel: en hebreo significa "Dios es fuerte", "Fortaleza de Dios". Aparece siempre como el mensajero de Yahvé para cumplir misiones especiales y como portador de buenas noticias. Anunció a Zacarías el nacimiento de Juan, el Bautista y a la Virgen María, la Encarnación del Hijo de Dios.

Arcángel San Rafael: su nombre quiere decir "medicina de Dios". Tiene un papel muy importante en la vida del profeta Tobías, al mostrarle el camino a seguir y lo que tenía que hacer. Tobías obedeció en todo al arcángel San Rafael, sin saber que era un mensajero de Dios. Él se encargó de presentar sus oraciones y obras buenas a Dios, dejándole como mensaje bendecir y alabar al Señor, hacer siempre el bien y no dejar de orar. Se le considera patrono de los viajeros por haber guiado a Tobías en sus viajes. Es patrono, también, de los médicos (de cuerpo y alma) por las curaciones que realizó en Tobit y Sara, el padre y la esposa de Tobías. encomiéndate a tu Ángel de la guardia para que te ayude a aspirar a los bienes de arriba

OCTUBRE MES DEL ROSARIO

En la antigüedad, romanos y griegos poseían la costumbre de coronar sus estatuas con rosas u otras flores, simbolizando el homenaje y reverencia que a ellas prestaban. Adoptando para sí esa costumbre, las mujeres cristianas que eran llevadas al martirio, vestían sus ropas más bellas y adornaban sus frentes con coronas de rosas, mostrando el enorme contento que poseían de ir al encuentro del Señor. A la noche los cristianos recogían las flores, y por cada rosa recitaban una oración o un salmo por las mártires.

De ahí nació la costumbre recomendada por la Iglesia de rezar el rosario, que consistía en recitar los 150 salmos de David, que eran considerados una oración extremadamente agradable a Dios. Entretanto, no todos podían seguir esa recomendación: saber leer en aquella época era reservado apenas a los cultos y letrados. Para los que no podían hacerlo, la Iglesia permitió substituir los 150 salmos por 150 Ave-Marías. A este "rosario" se pasó a llamar "el salterio de la Virgen". Por eso 15 minutos antes de empezar la misa rezaremos un Rosario.
