Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

February 24, 2019

*Merciful and gracious is the LORD,
 slow to anger and abounding in kindness.
 — Psalm 103:8*

DO NO HARM

We listen quite a while before we get to the “punch line” of the first reading today: even though it would be an easy thing to do, David will not harm the anointed one of the Lord. We, of course, know that Jesus is the Messiah, the anointed one of God, but the Bible uses this term for many different people. It is scripture’s way of indicating who has been chosen by God for a special place and mission in salvation history.

In today’s Gospel, Jesus presents a greatly enlarged list of those who, as children of God, we should not harm, but love instead: our enemies, those who curse us or do us harm, those who owe us money, the ungrateful, the wicked. The point of Jesus’ teaching is not to encourage these kinds of behaviors in others, but rather to form us in the image of our heavenly Father by increasing our opportunities to love unconditionally, expecting no return; to be merciful and forgiving, even when it would be easier not to.

TREASURES OF OUR TRADITIONS

When the Roman Empire turned a favorable eye toward the once-persecuted Christians, among the effects was a population explosion in the baptismal font, as Christian sympathizers stepped from the shadows. With more and more people becoming Christians, laws were passed to protect Sunday as a work-free day. Soon, it became possible to celebrate Mass later in the morning, rather than the older custom of gathering before dawn to celebrate Eucharist.

Amazingly, despite the increasing numbers of Christians, there was great resistance to adding to the number of worship events; the Eucharist that began as a few friends around a table soon was transformed into a more formal event with throngs crowding a large hall. All the Christians in a city or town would gather around the bishop for the one Sunday Eucharist, and only when the crowds became unmanageable was there an impulse to divide the assembly by splitting off a new bishop and flock.

Now, sixteen hundred years later, many parishes see a need to trim or combine Mass schedules. This is often seen as tough surgery. Yet our forebears in the faith would see it as a gain: a filling up of the Eucharist with a large and vigorous assembly, a fullness of ministry, an opportunity to make the Church more fully visible and stronger for service.

BLACK HISTORY MONTH

ARETHA FRANKLIN—The Queen of Soul

The fourth of five children, Aretha Louise Franklin was born on March 25, 1942, in Memphis Tennessee, but Detroit, Michigan was where she called home. The daughter of a Baptist preacher and a gospel singer, she grew up singing, as well as playing the piano and organ in her father's church.

Throughout her career, and whether she sang about love or life or for the Lord, you could hear, and feel, those roots planted firmly in her music.

Aretha was just a teenager when she recorded her first album, *Song of Faith*, in 1956. Five years later, after a move to New York to sign with Columbia Records, she released the album "Aretha." That was only the beginning. By the late 60s and with a label switch to Atlantic Records, the hits started coming. First there was "Do Right Woman, Do Right Man," from the 1967 album "I Never Loved a Man the Way I Love You." The title track was a monster hit too. This was followed soon after by "Respect," which not only became an anthem, but also topped the charts and earned Aretha the first two of her 18 Grammy Awards.

Here catalog includes classics that continue to stand the test of time. Consider: "Rock Steady, Chain of Fools, Ain't Nothing Like the Real Thing" and many more.

There is the Sparkle Soundtrack, which was as much a cultural phenomenon as the 1976 film itself. In 1980 she signed with Arista Records, which remained her label for more than two decades.

Along her journey, there were highs and lows, both personal and professional, but she endured. Even with the highs and lows she blessed us with beautiful songs. She sang at the funeral of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. and gospel great Mahalia Jackson, as well as for the inauguration of President Jimmy Carter, Bill Clinton and Barack Obama. In 2005 President George W. Bush presented her with the prestigious Presidential Medal of Freedom.

Along with going down in history as the first woman to be inducted into the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame. She also sits atop Rolling Stone's list of the greatest singers, male or female, of all time.

The foundation she laid has served as a stepping store for the many female vocalists who have followed her lead—from the late Whitney Houston, Mary J Blige and Kelly Price, to Faith Evans, Jennifer Hudson and many others.

Aretha's last performance was in November 2017, when she took the stage at the Elton John's AIDS Foundation 25th Anniversary Gala. In February of that year she announced her retirement from touring. The Queen of Soul did more than just supply the soundtrack of her generation and beyond. Her music, her voice, was, and shall remain, woven into the tapestry of our culture. She was the gold standard and she'll always be the Queen.

Aretha Franklin passed away on August 16, 2018.

TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

Según san Mateo, una noche mientras los discípulos estaban en la barca de Pedro, Jesús vino hacía ellos caminando sobre el mar. Ellos se espantaron creyendo que era un fantasma de algún pescador pero él los calmó diciendo “¡Ánimo!, que soy yo; no teman”. San Pedro, que fue pescador, está en casa sobre la barca, ya que normalmente son barcas de pescadores las que forman la procesión. Esta procesión reconoce el caos del mar reconociendo a los pescadores, que durante el año perdieron sus vidas en el mar, con guirnaldas lanzadas a la bahía. Pero, esta procesión no se espanta del mar ya que es una fiesta en honor de dos siervos de aquel que camina sobre las aguas, dominando el mar.
