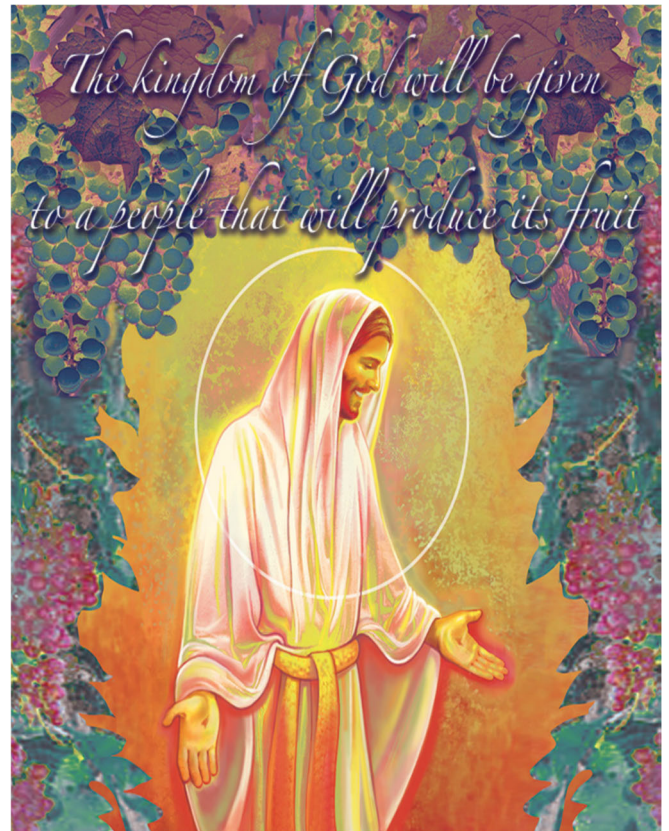

BEARING THE RIGHT KIND OF FRUIT

Today's readings focus our attention on vineyards. Isaiah's song concerning his friend's vineyard begins with inspiring and poetic images of an idyllic vineyard where the choicest harvest is expected. Instead, the vineyard yields wild grapes, which causes the owner to abandon it. The psalmist cries out to God, asking that God once again take care of the vineyard, which is the house of Israel. The parable told in today's Gospel offers a stern warning that those who commit treachery in the hopes of attaining personal wealth will be "put . . . to a wretched death" (Matthew 21:41). Jesus warns his listeners not to act like the murderous tenants in the vineyard. Instead he exhorts them to produce the kind of fruit that will lead them to the kingdom of God.

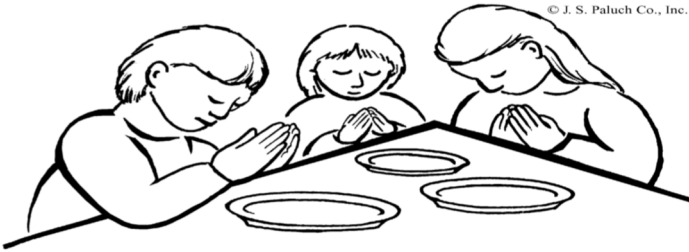

PASTOR'S CORNER - Fr. Bernardin Mugabo

Continued - The City of Lisboa (Lisbon) the capital of Portugal is built on the Atlantic coast. Watching the city from the sky, houses are beautiful, roads are wide and clean. They have so many roundabouts just like all countries in Europe. There are so many apartments, but few houses. All buildings look almost the same. Walls are painted white; roofs are made of red tiles. What I loved the most about the town was when they built it they always left a space where natural trees or vegetation is left alone. Lisbon has the lungs of the country, a huge space with original trees and vegetation to purify the air. It took us almost two hours from Lisbon to Fatima. Even though they drive on the right like here, sometimes I found it confusing especially in the town. Signs are not as clear as ours; the numbers on the houses are not easily seen as well. On the way to Fatima, the guide was telling us how cork is their main product of exportation. One can see trees with their bark taken out. I thought that once a tree has its bark taken off, it would be the end of it but these trees are very tough. They regenerate 7 times before they die completely. From cork, they make expensive shoes, which are very pricey. Guess what, it looks just like that cork used on bottles of wine and Champaign. I had no idea that a bark of a tree would do all those things. What I love the most is that the product from a cork tree is water proof. They also make glue from the resin collected from another kind of tree. Resin is made out of small pieces of bark taken from these trees Arriving in Fatima we went to a house of a woman living close to the town where the 3 visionary children were born. She had all kinds of good food served buffet style. I don't know if she did it out of her faith, or if she was paid. Food for 67 people and the way it was made looks like she might have spent many days preparing it. The problem is that it was small house and not enough places to sit for everybody. Some were standing in the house, while others were outside. Hornets and bees wanted to share our the food. That made me little nervous, but thanks be to God those insects were not aggressive. In that small town of Valinhos, there were so many tourists and roads were very narrow. From there we went to the hotel reserved for us called Aurea Fatima Hotel - very new and modern. It is located very close to the shrine of Fatima. In Fatima, one can feel peace emanating from that Holy place the Blessed Virgin Mary visited. I would hear people singing either for masses or for rosaries. I was very happy to find a private place where I could rest as I wanted. (To be continued)

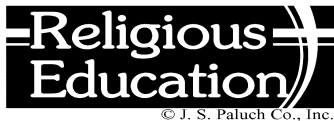

Reflection on today's second reading (Philippians 4:6-9):

St. Paul wrote this letter when the community of believers were experiencing some external and internal challenges. The external issues came from opponents who did not share the Philippian's conviction about the Gospel. This led to internal differences within the community about how to handle the situation. St. Paul's advice: "Brothers and sisters: have no anxiety at all, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, make your requests known to God... Then the God of peace will be with you."
