Our Learning

Dear Families,

We had another great week in Kindergarten! This week we will learn how to correctly form and sound out the letter d, complete our first chapter in math on numbers one to five, complete chapter two in religion titled "God Gives Me Five Senses", begin our first science unit on Force Olympics, and I will complete my one on one reading assessments.

The book bags with the leveled reading books will come home next week!

I have sent home a copy of the "Is it Bullying" poster from our counselor. I would like for us all to try and use these key words: Joking Around, Conflict, Mean Moment, and last bullying. The definition of bullying is "when an individual or group REPEATEDLY and INTENTIONALLY cause hurt or harm to another person." I would like us as a community to be mindful of labeling someone a bully. Most often in Kindergarten the children have a conflict with another student that can be resolved or an individual has a mean moment. We have been discussing this a lot at school. We may see some behavior that is developmentally appropriate for 5-6year olds. As a team I want us to work together to help them learn from these moments and begin conflict resolution.
