
## SACRAMENTS AND SACRAMENTALS

The seven sacraments of the Catholic Church are visible signs that celebrate what we believe about God and God's Church. They give God's grace to the Church and are a source of God's life for us.

Sacramentals are objects the Church considers sacred or holy because they prepare us to receive and work with the grace of the sacraments to bring us closer to God (see the *Catechism of the Catholic Church*, 1677).

You are probably familiar with many of these sacramentals. You might have seen some of these sacred objects in your parish church.

Candles




Palms
