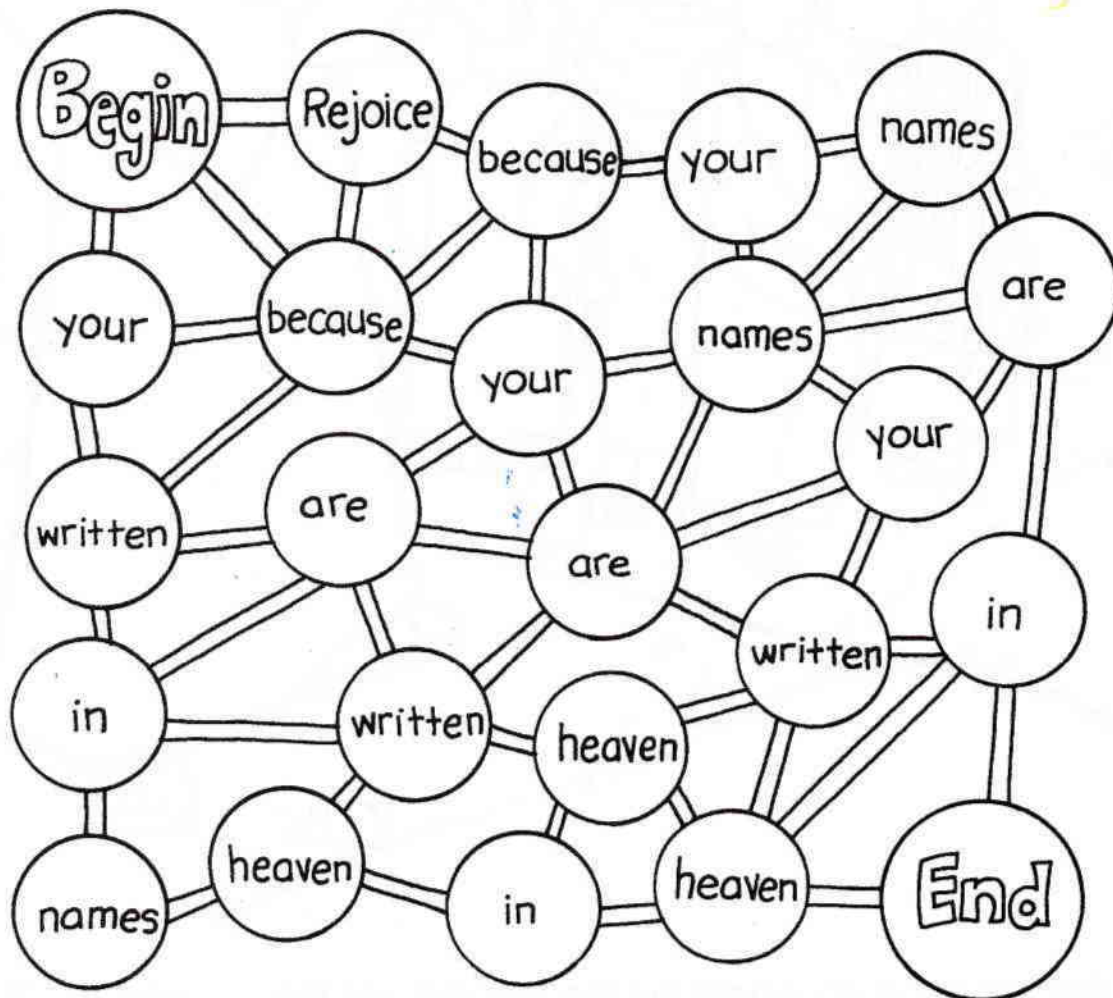

Today's psalm response is "Let all the earth cry out to God with joy!" (Psalm 66:1).
