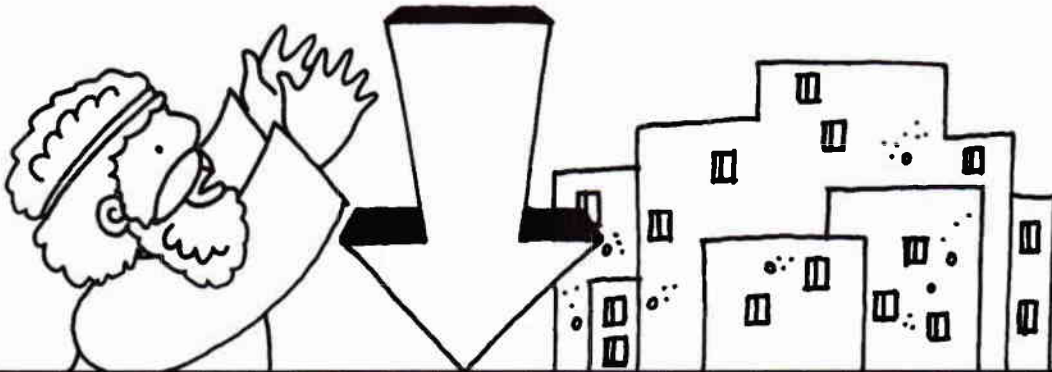

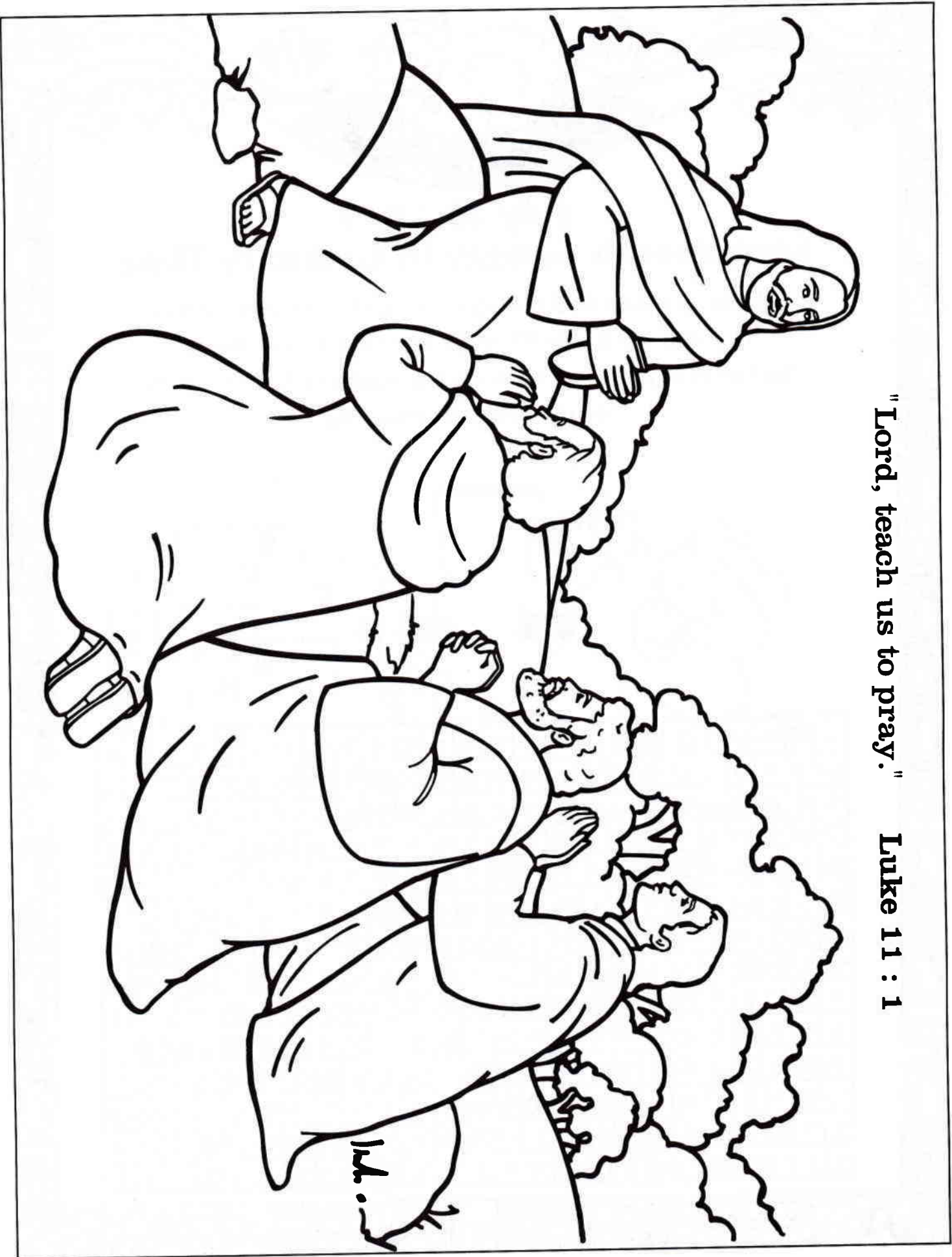

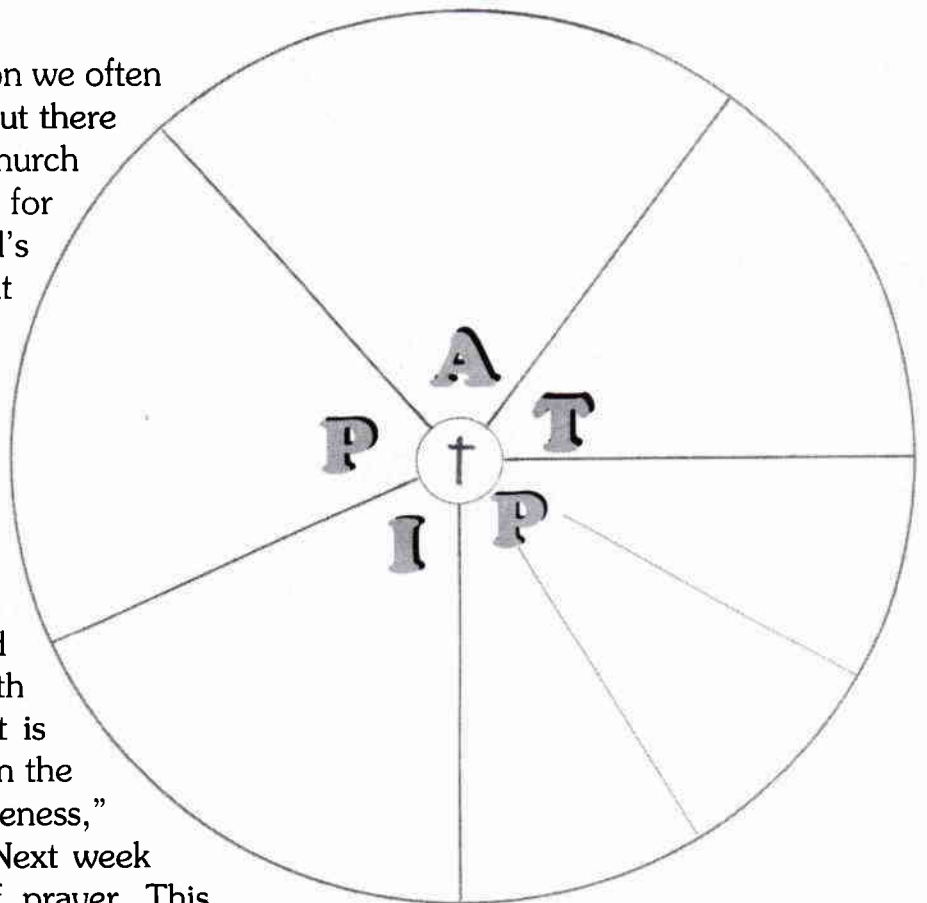


## TEACH US TO PRAY

In this Sunday's Gospel (Luke 11:1–13) one of Jesus' disciples says, "Lord, teach us to pray." The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* (2626–2643) teaches us that there are several forms of prayer. Two might be most familiar to you, prayers of thanksgiving and prayers of petition.

We pray in thanksgiving because we know that God is the giver of all good things. We thank God for our lives, our families, the world we live in, the food we eat. For what are you thankful? Can you make a list of five things? Ten things? Fifty things? If you named them all, how big a number would you need? Ask everyone in your family to add something to your list.

When we say a prayer of petition we often just ask God for things we need. But there are differed types of petition. The Church reminds us that we should also ask for the grace of forgiveness, that God's kingdom will come, and for all that we need. The Lord's Prayer, the Our Father, includes all of these forms of petition: "forgive us our trespasses . . . thy kingdom come . . . give us this day our daily bread."



This circle is divided into five sections, one for each different form of prayer. Write the word "Thanksgiving" in the section with a T. In the section marked P that is divided into parts write "Petition" in the first part, and below it write "Forgiveness," "God's reign," and "My needs." Next week we will add three other types of prayer. This week, use your list of things to be thankful for in your nightly prayer. Try to use all three types of petition in your daily prayer. End your prayers by saying the Our Father.

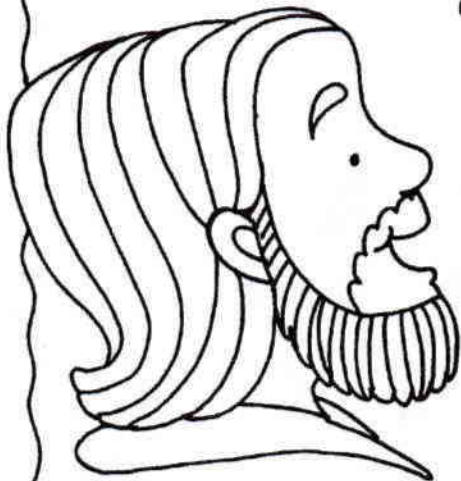
