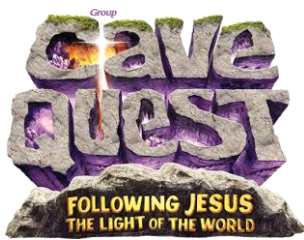

PERSONNEL CHANGES

July 1, 2016

As I explained Sunday in my homily, Holy Trinity Catholic Church is being led by the Holy Spirit in a new direction. This new move of the Holy Spirit is both exciting and at the same challenging!

Beginning September 2016, we will have a Parochial Vicar (Assistant Priest) Father Sam Matthieson. He will help to meet the needs of our parish. A second priest will add a cost to payroll in the amount of \$45,000.00 a year, about \$4,000.00 per month. I believe that you can help with this increased cost of payroll by increasing your generous church donations.

I know that Fr. Matthieson will bless us all with his wonderful vocation to the Priesthood. We are making sacrifices in the office by reducing payroll to help the increased cost.

Isabel, our long time receptionist, is no longer with us. We will use those savings to offset partly the above increased cost. There will be other changes with employees this budget year to save more money.

I am very grateful for the dedication and hard work that Isabel gave to the church in Howard County. She has been a super employee and served us well!

Please pray for each other as we follow the Holy Spirit in this new direction for Holy Trinity Catholic Church. I am confident that we will continue to flourish and grow as a parish.

Mission Appeal from COAR

COAR, which stands for the Community Oscar Arnulfo Romero, will be making an upcoming mission appeal and asking for your donations, prayers, and interest.

COAR is located in Zaragoza, El Salvador. It was founded in 1980 by a Cleveland Diocese Mission Team Priest, Fr. Ken Myers during El Salvador's brutal civil war. Fr. Ken and fellow Cleveland Mission Team Members, Sr. Dorothy Kazel, OSU, and Jean Donovan (murdered December 2, 1980) began gathering orphans from refugee camps and bringing them back to the Mission's parish of Zaragoza.

COAR is now known as the "Children's Village" in El Salvador with 800 day students, 100 in foster care, a medical and dental clinic, pharmacy, trade shops (such as baking and tailoring). COAR buzzes with optimism and vitality.

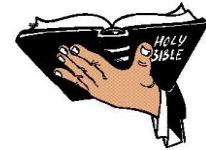

Sunday's Reflections
Colossians 1:15-20

CREATING LIFE, MAKING PEACE

Often the right person can make things happen. In the family, a business, a club, or a choir, the enthusiasm and expertise that one person brings can make all the parts work together.

In some families, there is one person who gathers people together, and who makes them laugh and cry, celebrate who they are, and tend to those less fortunate. In some business, there is one person with the right vision to fashion a project that makes a real difference in peoples' lives. Even at school, one person might give a class its character, a natural leader whose creativity brings life and whose compassion helps enemies make peace.

In some small way, those images explain the role of Christ in the universe. The Letter to the Colossians says he is "the firstborn of all creation" and "firstborn from the dead." "In him were created all things in heaven and on earth." He is the first to rise from the dead, "that in all things he himself might be preeminent." In these ways, Christ Jesus is the first of everything.

But Christ is also the unity of everything. Because he is the firstborn of all creation, "in him all things hold together." Because he is the firstborn from the dead, he reconciles all things, "making peace by the blood of his cross."

We may strive to create life and to bring peace, but we do it as disciples of Christ.
