Sunday's Reflections
Hebrews 9:24-28

ONCE AND FOR ALL

Some music groups were called “one-hit wonders.” They produced a song that rose to the top of the charts, but then you never heard from them again. They kept writing, singing, and recording, but they never scored another popular tune.

Other groups were deemed more successful if they produced hit after hit, year after year. By repeatedly coming up with popular songs, they proved their value. Yet even these groups eventually failed. Their past songs will be known as “oldies” as their creativity wanes.

Some of the work we do has to be produced again and again. Even if we have one successful year, it usually isn't enough to last forever.

The Letter to the Hebrews contrasts the annual work of Old Testament high priests with the one sacrifice of Jesus. High priests had to offer sacrifice for themselves and for the people every year. But Jesus offered his sacrifice once and for all. He did not have to renew it. By offering his own blood on the altar of the cross, he has appeared once for all “to take away sin by his sacrifice.” Jesus was no one-hit wonder. His work never failed. It continues afresh every day, every generation, every life.

We are sometimes discouraged by our endless toil. There are days we wonder if our work will ever cease. We are not perfect, but Christ is. His one sacrifice has brought us salvation.
