

LAY MISSION PROJECT

In his Strategic Plan released in March of 2012, Bishop Jaime Soto responded to the need for increasing the laity's knowledge of the faith by committing to certifying an additional 500 lay ministry leaders over the next five years. When The ONE Campaign was launched in 2013, The ONE Campaign Lay Formation Fund was established to help underwrite this cost. We are pleased to announce that the endowment is now partially funding the Lay Mission Project in the Diocese of Sacramento.

Many educational programs exist that prepare the laity for the pastoral care of the baptized in activities known as lay ecclesial ministry – for example: catechesis, visiting the sick or homebound, and in liturgical ministries such as lectoring, ushering, etc. However, such activities are extraordinary with respect to the call of the layperson.

The primary and ordinary call of the laity is the care of the secular order. We can transform secular society by living the faith in all aspects of life, primarily through family, social and occupational circles. The Lay Mission Project seeks to provide a process of formation that is accessible to the often busy lifestyle of the average lay Catholic.

The first group of participants will begin classes in August. If you desire to become a lay leader or if you wish to help raise funds to help others grow in their understanding of Catholic Doctrine. Application forms available at scddec.org/advanced or laymission.net.
