WEEKLY REFLECTIONS

Question of the Week

For Children: Jesus teaches us to be humble – but what does that mean? How do you show you are humble?

For Youth: God knows when we are doing things just for show, and when they come from the goodness of our heart. When have you caught yourself doing something just to be more popular or liked? How does it feel to do something that you know is good and just?

For Adults: This Gospel reading suggests that we approach God and each other with humility. What does this mean, in practical terms? How do we "humble" ourselves? What does that mean?

Liturgy of the Word

In our Gospel today, Jesus describes two men who went to the temple to pray, but only one comes away justified. The book of Sirach tells us that the one who serves God willingly is heard. As we hear and pray about these scriptures today, let us listen for clues about the kind of prayer our loving God wishes to hear from us.

HURRICANE MATTHEW

Earlier this month Hurricane Matthew devastated significant parts of the Southeast coast of the United States and some countries in the Caribbean, especially Haiti. Next weekend, *October 29/30*, we will take up a special collection to support the efforts of *Catholic Relief Services* and *Catholic Charities USA* as they reach out to provide humanitarian aid in the form of water, food, shelter, and medical care, as well as to their long term efforts to restore communities after widespread destruction, and to the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops for the pastoral and reconstruction needs of the Church in the Caribbean and the US. We must unite ourselves through prayer and solidarity with their dire plight. Catholic Charities USA and Catholic Relief Services are already at work in the areas affected by the hurricane. All Saints Day: All Saints Day, *Tuesday, November 1st*, is a Holy Day of Obligation. We will celebrate Mass at 6:30am, 9:00am and 5:30pm in English and at 7:00pm in Spanish.
