From the Pastor

Sevenfold Gifts of the Holy Ghost, conclusion

The next aspect of the gifts is that of holiness, the cleansing of the heart from corruption, for which three gifts are at work. First, the gift of the fear of the Lord which gives us a properly ordered fear that will help restrain the passions and move us to do the good we ought to do. It helps us to be filial and reverential toward God as Father. Secondly, the gift of piety that helps us to have or maintain the proper dispositions to serve God with tenderness and devotion. If these dispositions are lacking, then perseverance becomes very difficult and our prayers dry. This gift essentially helps us to practice all our religious duties. Thirdly, the gift of counsel helps us to discern between spiritual and carnal impulses. We must do all things for God, whether we are performing our daily duties or spending time in prayer. This gift helps us accomplish our tasks in a manner that helps us grow in sanctity.

The third aspect of the gifts is that of strength of spirit. Our wills have to be strengthened to resist temptations and this strength comes from the gift of fortitude. It helps us with endurance in persecution, performance of our penances, and in all trials and difficulties. It helps us to be firm in resisting evil, courageous before the temptations of the world and to persevere in our own struggles against the weaknesses of the flesh. In short, this gift helps us with perseverance in virtue.

Let us pray for an increase in the Gifts of the Holy Ghost so that their increase in us will help us to continue the work of purifying our souls. Neglect of these gifts will lead us foolish decisions, to a stagnant spiritual life (or more likely going in reverse), and to weakness in fighting temptations. On the other hand, as our souls are purified, the gifts will in turn be increased. Our progress in holiness will increase more quickly.
