

Reverend Eric Flood, FSSP District Superior of North America

Born in Ohio, Fr. Eric Flood was the second child and eldest son in a family of four boys and a girl. Both of his parents had considered a religious life prior to marriage, and their home was filled with love and warmth for their own children and the foster children that came to live with them. One of the foster children, a severely handicapped child with cystic fibrosis, was adopted; in the 25 years he lived, he brought much love and joy to the family.

Fr. Flood went to the University of Dayton and graduated with an electrical engineering degree. Discerning that he had a priestly vocation after realizing he “preferred praying to hanging out with friends”, he entered the Priestly Fraternity of St. Peter. He was ordained in 2000 by Bishop Timlin of Scranton, Pennsylvania, and served in Omaha, Nebraska for three years, then as pastor of St. John Vianney Chapel in Maple Hill, Kansas.

In February 2008, at the age of 39, he was appointed North American District Superior of the Priestly Fraternity of St. Peter. On July 14, 2012, Superior General Fr. John Berg reappointed him for a three year term.
